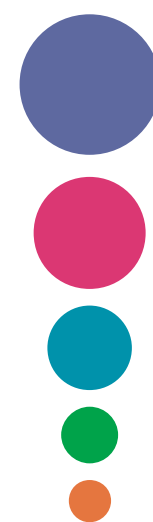

Arts Council confirms HMS will be Music Hub Leader for Hampshire.

Hampshire County Council's Music Service is delighted to announce its appointment as the lead partner for the new Hampshire Music Education Hub.

The Arts Council announcement confirmed that HMS will lead a range of partners in the development of this new structure for music education. As one of a network of hubs across the country, the Hampshire Hub will be responsible for meeting government targets on the range and quality of key aspects of music education.

As lead partner, HMS will be responsible for ensuring the best possible quality music education for all young people in Hampshire. This will mean that at every stage of a young person's life, their musical experience is the best it can be. With signposts to a range of providers, young people will be able to access the right musical opportunities at the right time and the right place.

Hubs explained

A new way forward for Hampshire

“The Importance of Music, A National Plan for Music Education” was published by the government in November 2011. It sets out new responsibilities and ways of working for schools, local authorities, and local music and arts organisations. Its vision is that new Music Education Hubs will develop a range of partnerships to deliver a wider and more coherent set of music education opportunities for all children and young people.

The funding for Hubs is focussed on whole-class instrumental teaching, ensemble opportunities, progression routes and a singing strategy. Hubs will also be encouraged to provide CPD to school staff, an instrument loan service and access to large-scale and high-quality musical events.

Jill Lerner, Head of HMS, said, “Hampshire Music Service is well-placed to lead the Hampshire Music Education Hub. We value highly our existing relationships with schools, and look forward to working in stronger partnership with other organisations to offer all young people the best music education.”
