



# Services for Young Children 2018/19 Centrally Funded Inclusion Training opportunities

As part of our centrally funded inclusion training programme, all setting SENCOs are advised to attend the one day SENCO Induction course (6 hours) as well as an additional 2 days (12 hours) of training made up of any of the courses below. This equates to the previous 3 day SENCO Induction course (18 hours). The training workshops below are also open to any early year's practitioners with an interest in inclusion.

A maximum of two members of staff per setting can be considered for a place.

From the **1 September 2018** a charge of **£50** will be made for cancellations of less than 24 hours notice or non-attendance.

## **SENCO Induction**

This one day course provides practical information about the role of the SENCO and the policies and procedures that SENCOs need to help them meet the needs of SEN children in their setting. Learners will further increase their knowledge of the SENCO role and responsibilities by developing and understanding a range of children's special educational needs and ways to meet those needs. Emphasis will be placed on developing a positive relationship with parents who are encouraged to become a part of the planning. It will also provide a framework for liaising effectively with schools.

## **Attachment**

This one day course introduces the key concepts of attachment theory and emotional attachment. It enables practitioners to reflect on the effectiveness of their environment and practice in enabling individual children's emotional and developmental needs to be met.

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## **Autism Awareness**

This half day course has been developed as part of Hampshire's Autism Strategy to raise awareness and understanding of autism in the wider workforce. It is aimed at all early years

practitioners and aims to develop their understanding of autism and the way it affects children in early years settings.

### **The Communication Tree**

This half day course aims to develop practitioners' understanding of the various aspects of speech, language and communication including exploring top tips and practical activities to support and encourage language development.

### **Promoting Positive Behaviour**

This is a course which consists of three half day sessions. Session one looks at the underlying causes of behaviour and teaches delegates ways of analysing children's behaviour. Session two explores ways of creating an environment that encourages positive behaviour for all children. Session three explores ways of working with individual children who have more challenging behaviour and offers practical strategies to support them.
