Support4SEND is...

- A free service for Hampshire children and young people (0-25 years) and their parents
- Confidential
- Impartial
- Friendly, welcoming and great at listening
- Support4SEND can work with you on your own or work with you and your parents. It is your choice.

How can Support4SEND help?

- Listen to your views and concerns
- Help you explore your options
- Help you have confidence to ask questions and make choices
- Help you fill in forms and understand letters and reports
- Organise meetings in school or college
- Help you prepare for meetings with school or college
- Go with you to meetings and help you give your views
- Explain the difficult words people use
- Explain your legal rights in relation to special educational needs and









Examples of the things Support4SEND help with...

- · Getting extra support from school or college
- Having difficult conversations with school or college
- Making sure medical needs won't stop you from learning
- Giving advice if you've been excluded or are at risk of exclusion
- Applying for an Education, Health and Care Plan (EHC Plan)
- Making a complaint

Confidentiality

We will only share information with others if:

- · you have given your consent for us to do so, or
- the information given to us leads us to believe that a child/young person is at risk

Impartiality

This means we will:

- provide factual information and advice based on the law and quidance so that you are able to make your own decisions
- not tell you what to do or offer our own opinions

What does SEND mean?

The term SEND (Special Educational Needs or Disabilities) is a broad description for anyone who needs additional help to progress and achieve in education.

You might need extra help because you have:

A medical condition or health needs A learning difficulty like dyslexia or dyspraxia

Difficulties with communication Difficulties with social interactions A physical disability

Behavioural difficulties and frustrations

You do not have to have a diagnosis. Support4SEND works with anyone who needs additional help.
