Listen2Me

No increase to prices for the 2013/14 academic year, £1,200 per year per class (timetabled as 1 hour per week, 45 minutes contact)

Listen2Me is the Hampshire Music Service whole-class instrumental teaching programme through which each child is able to experience tuition on up to three different instruments during the year. Listen2Me also delivers national curriculum requirements and can be used to cover PPA time in schools.

Listen2Me2 'The Next Step'

No increase to prices for the financial year 2013/14, £38.50 per hour

After a year of Hampshire's exciting Listen2Me project, children wanting to continue to learn an instrument can learn together in a Listen2Me2 group.

- Children can be taught in large groups (between 8 and 12) for a minimum of 30 minutes
- Parents can hire instruments which children will be able to take home to practise whilst they are having their L2M2 lessons
- Instrument-specific resources and guidance have been created by HMS to support L2M2 'The Next Step' and are available on the HMS website – www.hants.gov.uk/hms
- The school is charged at the HMS instrumental hourly rate which can be passed on to parents. As the group sizes are large this significantly reduces the termly cost per pupil
- Find out how many children currently doing L2M would like to continue to learn an instrument. Consider having a letter to give to pupils and parents at the L2M concert – ask the HMS teacher to talk to parents at the concert about L2M2 'The Next Step'. Experience shows that continuation is greatly increased where schools are pro-active in encouraging pupils to take up L2M2.

Instrumental and Vocal Tuition

No increase to prices for the financial year 2013/14, £38.50 per hour

Lessons can be provided in brass, woodwind, strings, keyboard, percussion, guitar and voice.

Students are taught mostly in groups, promoting ensemble skills and preparing them for joining bands and orchestras.

Celebration and assessment of progress can be done at no cost to students through the HMS Certificates of Achievement.

Low cost instrument hire is available to students having lessons with HMS teachers.

HMS provides high quality teachers who are developed and monitored through regular CPD and performance management and supported with HMS schemes of work and resources.

HMS provides **3000 hours of teaching per week**. When completing the provision request form for instrumental/vocal lessons please consider offering times before and after school and give as much flexibility as possible. Do state any times that you really cannot accept instrumental lessons.

World Music Workshops

No increase to prices for the financial year 2013/14
 £180 half-day, £295 whole day, £695 six week residency

World music workshops are available in African drumming, samba, gamelan, Indian drumming and include some more unusual opportunities such as udu drumming and cajon.

Primary Class Music Teaching



No increase to prices for the financial year 2013/14, £38.50 per hour

Hampshire Music Service provides class music teachers to work alongside school staff (teachers or learning support assistants) to provide quality learning experiences for all children. This can be used to cover PPA time in schools.

After-School Clubs and Ensembles

No increase to prices for the financial year 2013/14, £38.50 per hour

With a dedicated workforce of tutors who have a wide range of skills, Hampshire Music Service is your one-stop-shop for exciting musical after-school club activities in all Key Stage settings.

	<p>Drum Club offers pupils the chance to try six World Music styles. The instruments are also available for school use during the day.</p>
	<p>Guitar Club is a chance for guitarists who can play a few chords to learn new styles, from Heavy Metal to Classic Rock, perform new songs, and play rhythm and lead guitar in a large group.</p>
<p>Rock School</p>	<p>Out of hours sessions for your school rock bands. A specialist tutor will coach your rock musicians to develop their ensemble playing, song writing and performance skills. (minimum 1 hour per week)</p>

Primary Curriculum Project

The offer to HCC schools as part of the Primary Curriculum Project includes:

- Access to all HMS published resources (new and existing) and access to web-based information and resources (includes additional planning exemplars)
- A termly newsletter
- Participation in an annual festival (vocal or recorder)
- A delegate place on our annual conference
- A delegate place for two one-day courses and two half-day courses

Additional visits and courses can be purchased:

- Courses (including special courses) - £70 per day or £35 per half day
- Conference - additional delegates - £90 per day, £45 per half day

Workshops

- Vocal / recorder half-day minimum - £165 half-day, £55 per hour
- Support for arts week / bespoke – £55 per hour



Primary Courses and Conferences

Develop music in your school through quality courses and conferences. A range of progressive courses designed to support music coordinators (new and established), other school staff (classroom teachers, NQTs, learning support assistants etc.).

- Annual Conference – A one day primary school/special school conference, details will be provided.
- Managing Music – A one-day course to support all music subject managers. A range of new ideas will be presented to expand and enrich your curriculum together with opportunities to discuss issues of music management.
- Music for NQTs – A one-day course providing NQTs with the opportunity to develop their music teaching skills in a friendly and non-threatening environment.
- Music in the Curriculum FS / KS1 / KS2 – A one-day course for any class teachers or LSAs to develop their music teaching skills with YR – Y6 pupils.
- Musical Spotlights – A series of half-day sessions designed to supplement the Music Managers' course. The titles of the Spotlights will be published ready for the academic year.
- Recorders Stage 1 and 2 – Two half-day courses exploring resources and technique for teaching the recorder. Stage 1 is for those new to recorder teaching and Stage 2 for those more experienced.



Curriculum Advice and Support

The HMS Primary Curriculum team can offer the following opportunities to help you develop music in your school:

- **Advice** on your music curriculum; auditing music provision in your school; action planning; developing a scheme of work; developing extra-curricular music; writing; planning; resourcing; policy wording
- **Monitoring and improvement**; observation of lessons to evaluate quality of curriculum delivery; demonstration of model lessons
- Help to prepare for **Ofsted inspections** or follow-up reports
- Local support for **clusters**
- **Mentoring** of school-based staff
- **Planning** with individual year groups and demonstration lessons
- An initial visit to **audit music** in your school followed by a series of linked activities to develop music according to specifically identified needs
- **Follow-up** with music manager or non-specialist teacher after their attendance on a central course to personalise ideas presented on these courses to your school

The Primary Curriculum team can work with governors, headteachers, music managers, year group leaders, non-specialist class teachers and learning support assistants. They can work on a one to one basis or with groups of staff. Choose a one-off visit or plan for a series of visits.

- Advisory visits - £55 per hour, £330 per day
- Whole staff CPD - £165 half-day / £165 twilight / £330 whole day



CPD, Workshop and Projects

The HMS Primary Curriculum team can offer the following CPD and workshop opportunities to help you develop music in your school:

- CPD for your staff to develop their musical knowledge, understanding and confidence in delivering the music curriculum. Whole / half-day or twilight sessions tailored to meet the specific needs of your school. £330 whole day / £165 half-day / £165 twilight

Choose from the following CPD sessions:

- Thinking it through (A) – planning for progression
- Thinking it through (B) – plans in action
- Musical kick-starts – warm-up activities and starter games
- Musical wake ups – brain gym and fun activities to invigorate your classes
- Music makers – composing and improvising
- Songs and vocal creations
- Rhythm explorers
- Pitch explorers
- Listening matters – focussed listening activities
- Making the links – choose from music and literacy, numeracy, the creative arts, history, geography, RE and PSHE
- In my back yard – music from Hampshire and the south of England
- Music outdoors
- Switching on – choose from recording sounds, software, the internet and keyboards
- Ask about bespoke sessions to suit your needs.

- A series of practical twilight CPD sessions with the whole staff focussing on specific areas of understanding, e.g. musical terminology / progression in musical skills / singing / listening skills / ICT / warm-up activities. £165 twilight
- Themed workshops and support for activities during art weeks. £55 per hour
- Post-SATs creative projects. £55 per hour / £165 half-day / £330 whole day

Music Education Hubs

‘The Importance of Music, A National Plan for Music Education’ sets out the responsibilities of schools, local authorities, national and local music and arts organisations and other music educators. Its vision is that new music education hubs will be formed to deliver the core and where possible extension roles outlined in the plan with partnership working at their core.

Hampshire Music Service is well placed to deliver on the core and extension roles, and indeed already works in partnership to offer these services.

Core roles	Delivered by HMS
a) Ensure that every child aged 5-18 has the opportunity to learn a musical instrument (other than voice) through whole-class ensemble teaching programmes.	✓
b) Provide opportunities to play in ensembles and to perform from an early stage.	✓
c) Ensure that clear progression routes are available and affordable to all young people.	✓
d) Develop a singing strategy to ensure that every pupil sings regularly and that choirs and other vocal ensembles are available in the area.	✓
Extension Roles	Delivered by HMS
a) Offer CPD to school staff, particularly in supporting schools to deliver music in the curriculum.	✓
b) Provide an instrument loan service, with discounts or free provision for those on low incomes.	✓
c) Provide access to large-scale and / or high quality music experiences for pupils, working with professional musicians and / or venues.	✓
