# Instrumental and Vocal Tuition

No increase to prices for the financial year 2013/14, £38.50 per hour

Lessons can be provided in brass, woodwind, strings, keyboard, percussion, guitar and voice.

Students are taught mostly in groups, promoting ensemble skills and preparing them for joining bands and orchestras.

Celebration and assessment of progress can be done at no cost to students through the HMS Certificates of Achievement.

Low cost instrument hire is available to students having lessons with HMS teachers.

HMS provides high quality teachers who are developed and monitored through regular CPD and performance management and supported with HMS schemes of work and resources.

HMS provides 3000 hours of teaching per week. When completing the provision request form for instrumental/vocal lessons please consider offering times before and after school and give as much flexibility as possible. Do state any times that you really cannot accept instrumental lessons.

# World Music Workshops

# After-School Clubs and Ensembles

No increase to prices for the financial year 2013/14, £38.50 per hour

With a dedicated workforce of tutors who have a wide range of skills, HMS is your one-stop-shop for exciting musical after-school club activities in all Key Stage settings. All available at the HMS hourly rate of £38.50.

<b>Rock School</b>	Out of hours sessions for your school rock bands. A specialist tutor will coach your rock musicians to develop their ensemble playing, song writing and performance skills. Ideal for GCSE performance or to support BTEC.
<b>Drum Club</b>	Drum Club offers pupils the chance to try six World Music styles. The instruments are also available for school use during the day.

# Benefits available to secondary schools and their pupils through working with Hampshire Music Service

FREE activities and resources designed to help schools support ALL Hampshire students

- **Free annual inspector visit.** For any secondary school buying in regular HMS teaching we will offer a free half-day visit from the County Music Inspector. The visit can be used to support any departmental priorities, but given the new national curriculum, KS3 planning would be an effective focus.
- **Free access** to HMS website with curriculum resources and guidance for teaching all KS3 / KS4 students.
- **Free newsletter** for music teachers, keeping staff up to date with local and national matters that affect music education and make a difference to your students.
- **Free local area panel support** – through attendance at area panel meetings by members of the HMS leadership team and offers of specific training as identified by the local panel where possible.

SUBSIDISED / partnership work, providing additional opportunities for students and teachers

- **Support for area or school activities.** We are often able to provide free support and can facilitate pyramid/cluster playing days. We can work in partnership to provide vocal, rock and world music workshops.
- **HMS projects.** HMS regularly organises large-scale events which involve ensembles and schools in joint performances.
- **Subsidised places at annual conference.** An opportunity for music teachers from across the county to meet together and share experiences and ideas. Workshops are led by national and local experts.
- **National development projects.** Through HMS contacts at a national level, schools can be at the forefront of new developments - such as the Musical Bridges project on KS2 /KS3 transition.

# Music Education Hubs

'The Importance of Music, A National Plan for Music Education' sets out the responsibilities of schools, local authorities, national and local music and arts organisations and other music educators. Its vision is that new music education hubs will be formed to deliver the core and where possible extension roles outlined in the plan with partnership working at their core.

Hampshire Music Service is well placed to deliver on the core and extension roles, and indeed already works in partnership to offer these services.

<b>Core roles</b>	<b>Delivered by HMS</b>
a) Ensure that every child aged 5-18 has the opportunity to learn a musical instrument (other than voice) through whole-class ensemble teaching programmes.	
b) Provide opportunities to play in ensembles and to perform from an early stage.	
c) Ensure that clear progression routes are available and affordable to all young people.	
d) Develop a singing strategy to ensure that every pupil sings regularly and that choirs and other vocal ensembles are available in the area.	
<b>Extension Roles</b>	<b>Delivered by HMS</b>
a) Offer CPD to school staff, particularly in supporting schools to deliver music in the curriculum.	
b) Provide an instrument loan service, with discounts or free provision for those on low incomes.	
c) Provide access to large-scale and / or high quality music experiences for pupils, working with professional musicians and / or venues.	

HMS is the Lead Partner in the Hampshire Music Hub.
