### **Enlargement of Bursledon Junior School.**

### **Description of current service/policy**

Bursledon Junior School currently has the capacity for 330 pupils to attend the school. The school is short of one classroom space to provide the same number of places per year group as the Infant school site. Bursledon Junior School at present are therefore not able to provide a place to all the children choosing to transfer from the infant school site over to the Junior school site in permanent facilities.

Geographical impact: Eastleigh

#### Description of proposed change

To make a prescribed alteration to BURSLEDON JUNIOR SCHOOL, Long Lane, Bursledon, Southampton, SO31 8BZ (category of school – Community) by enlarging the premises of the school, with effect from September 2018.

Bursledon Junior School will be enlarged by a one classroom extension, along with internal remodelling and external works. This expansion will increase the capacity of the school from 330 to 360 places.

The pressure for school places is a result of a rise in the number of births in the area and new housing development.

#### Impacts of the proposed change

#### **Engagement and consultation**

Has engagement or consultation been carried out? Yes

A formal consultation took place between 13 November and 22 December 2017, and a drop-in session was held at the school on 20 November 2017.

This consultation received a total of 5 written comments which were largely focused around traffic and parking around school.

The County Council felt that the provision of additional school places was necessary and that

comments received did not represent sufficient concern to prevent proceeding with the enlargement.

A public notice was issued between the 16 January and 2 March 2018, and no comments were received.
