

## What to do in the event of a COVID-19 case/s

### People living in a Shared Lives household

#### Someone in your household has coronavirus symptoms

Support the individual to **isolate** at home for 10 days and get a **test** by visiting [www.nhs.uk/coronavirus](http://www.nhs.uk/coronavirus) or calling **119**

Contact your Shared Lives Manager or if unavailable, the Shared Lives Duty number, who will be able to provide you with additional support and advice.

Remember that your household and **support bubble**, if you have one, will need to isolate for 14 days.

In the meantime, if the individual's test result is negative for COVID-19, your household can return to normal life.

Please contact your Shared Lives manager to let them know the result of the test.

#### Someone in your household tests positive for coronavirus

Contact your Shared Lives Manager or if unavailable, the Shared Lives Duty number, who will be able to provide you with additional support and advice.

The person testing positive will have been told by NHS Test and Trace to **isolate** at home for 10 days and their household and **support bubble** to isolate for 14 days.

The person testing positive will have been advised by NHS Test & Trace to share information about their close contacts inside and outside their home.

Once the isolation period is complete everyone in the household can return to normal life.

### Visitors

#### Someone who has spent time in your household tells you they have tested positive for coronavirus

They will have been told by NHS Test and Trace to **isolate** at home for 10 days and their household and **support bubble** to isolate for 14 days.

The individual testing positive will have been advised by NHS Test & Trace to tell their close contacts and share information about these individuals.

You do not need to take any action unless NHS Test and Trace contact you and advise you to self-isolate. This will usually happen within 24-48 hours.

Contact your Shared Lives Manager or, if unavailable, the Shared Lives Duty number, who will be able to provide you with additional support and advice.
