

Preparing for your child's Annual Review

If your child has an Education, Health and Care Plan (EHCP), it must be reviewed at least once a year.

The Annual Review is an important opportunity to look at how things are going and plan next steps.

What happens at the review?


- The school or college will arrange a meeting
- You, your child, and professionals will share your views
- Progress towards outcomes will be discussed
- New targets or changes may be recommended

Before the meeting, you will usually be asked to:

- Share your views about what is working well
- Highlight any challenges or concerns
- Think about what you would like to happen next

After the meeting:

- A report is sent to the local authority
- A decision is made about whether the EHCP stays the same, changes or is no longer needed
