### Hampshire-wide

Organisation	Project Summary	Awarded
Park Community School	Park Community School deliver several services including the MUNCH Community Pantry to support their most vulnerable families. This funding will provide up to 1,200 households with a warm pack including winter clothing, flasks, hot water bottles and fleece blankets to support the most vulnerable. They are working with 18 pantries across Hampshire and 34 Libraries in 11 districts to distribute these in September, in preparation for the colder months.	£43,200

Organisation	Project Summary	Awarded

Basingstoke Discovery Centre	To provide a 'brunch bag' to supplement their literacy programme. The funding will cover the cost of 20 healthy brunch bags a week for 16 weeks and is aimed at children attending the library's literacy programme that are eligible for free school meals or identified by local agencies as needing additional support with food provision.	£1,000
Inspero	The charity provides a range of services in the Basingstoke community, such as food banks, wellbeing programmes, children's forest school and horticulture work placements. The funding will cover provision of fresh produce for food parcels, and to support 96 children attending cooking classes run by a professional chef. It will also cover the cost of materials to run a grow and eat learning project where children learn to grow fruit and vegetables.	£5,491
Popley Fields Community Association	The registered charity is looking to run a four-week cooking activity for families. The funding will provide 30 families attending these activities with meal bags containing ingredients and recipes each week, with a joint lunch organised for all the participating families at the end of the period.	£3,100
Tadley Community Primary School	To support families in financial difficulty with food vouchers.	£400
Tadley Community Primary School	The school is seeking to support their families most in need. This funding will supplement the school's discretionary grant to support a further four families identified in urgent need of support with food. It will give each family a £100 food voucher.	£400
Westside Community Association	The community association runs a community pantry. The funding will cover the cost of putting together 100 energy saving boxes containing draught excluders, energy efficient bulbs, hot water bottles, socks and scarves, as required to pensioners and families with children, to maximise energy efficiency and minimise the cost of utility bills.	£5,200
Whitchurch Conservation Group	Whitchurch Conservation Group is a community group with over 800 members. Apart from the work they do to conserve the area's biodiversity, the group also supports vulnerable households in the community. This funding will enable them to distribute food vouchers worth £100 each to up to 125 local families and pensioners who are identified by local church groups and community networks to be struggling financially.	£15,800

Headley Down Foodbank	To provide up to 60 households with food bags and utility and supermarket vouchers.	£5000
Herne Junior School	This school wish to use this funding to top up on their discretionary grant to support one family with needs including as white goods and cooking equipment to enable them to prepare healthy meals at home.	£1,000
Liss Foodbank	Liss Foodbank are a community group who provide weekly food parcels in direct response to households and those that have been referred to them in Liss and the surrounding villages. The funding will enable them to top up their surplus and donated food supplies to support up to 40 households over a 6-month period.	£5,040
New Life Domestic	To provide carpeting and flooring to improve insulation for dwellings with concrete floors. It is anticipated that this will help up 7 households based on a budget of £1,500 per household.	£10,500

Organisation	Project Summary	Awarded
Hiltingbury Infant School	To support a family with the costs of food and energy bills.	£200
Netley Christian Fellowship	This church organisation runs a basic food bank with the aid of volunteers. This funding is to replenish food and toiletry supplies that have been depleted due to the high demand in recent months. The funding will support up to 75 beneficiaries over a period of six months.	£5,000
Saint James CoE Primary School	The school has witnessed a growing number of vulnerable families. Since COVID, the number of free school meals registered families has grown and continues to do so within the school. This funding will top up their discretionary grant funds so they can support a further two families to carpet their otherwise uncarpeted home, ready for the winter months.	£850

### Fareham

Organisation	Project Summary	Awarded
Fareham Library	The community library brings individuals, communities and services together, thereby making better use of available public funds and improving outcomes for people. The library offers an extensive activity and learning programme which meets the needs of library users- promoting literacy, health, wellbeing, and digital skills. This funding will allow the library to support up to 200 households, including pensioners, with a food voucher to enjoy a summer	£1,708

	picnic lunch box that can be eaten on site along with accessing the activities and learning programme running this summer holiday.	
Hampshire Food Revolution	This voluntary organisation was founded to redistribute surplus food otherwise destined for landfill to the local community. More recently, in response to the rising cost of living they have focussed on supporting vulnerable families in the community. The dwindling supply of surplus food has mean that they have to supplement stocks with purchased food. The funding will supplement their supplies for the weekly food parcels distributed to 300 families and also cover the increase in demand from Ukrainian families.	£3,000
Portchester Community Association	This registered charity is a Community Hub and pantry, providing support to vulnerable members of the community. A portion of this funding will support with a free lunch club, that will run once a week in September, to support 25 different pensioners a week. The remaining funds will be used to top up food provisions to support 16 of the most vulnerable households in the community.	£4,090
Sarisbury CE Junior School	This will support 31 vulnerable families with utility and food vouchers.	£1,240
Waypoint Hub	The registered organisation provides food for local families on low income, as well as support with essentials. The funding will go towards the provisions for meal ingredients, for 99 households to be able to cook a meal each week, for 26 weeks and warm clothing, supporting up to 244 households.	£12,000
Waypoint Hub	The registered organisation and church run a community pantry for households who are struggling with food insecurity and poverty. This funding will enable them to purchase equipment to be able grow food in their community garden to supplement the provision of fruit and vegetables to the Community Pantry that they run.	£1,250

## Gosport

Organisation	Project Summary	Awarded
Acts of Kindness Community	The charity provide crisis support to families and individuals in Gosport, Fareham, and the surrounding area, in the form of food, sanitary and toiletries parcels. This funding will enable them to provide food and care parcels to up to 1,040 households, and a further 40-50 households with white goods.	£12,500
Citizen's Advice	This funding will enable the organisation to provide 150 food vouchers to Gosport residents referred to their service who are facing food poverty and in urgent need. This differs to the funding provided to Citizens Advice for fuel and utility bill support.	£10,000

Empower Global	The church and registered organisation supports vulnerable members of the Gosport community through its food bank, children's clothing & toy bank, and youth outreach group. This funding will enable them to support up to 180 households for a 6-month period with £10,000 of the grant being for food provisions and £4,000 for essentials such as toiletries.	£14,000
Gosport Pantry	The group run a community pantry to support those that are in financial hardship in the community. With this funding they will provide up to 60 households with sustainable and eco-friendly personal hygiene items.	£4,000
St. Mary's Church	The Church provides cooked meals, food packages as well as essential provisions and children's clothes for 40 families to support throughout the holiday period. This funding will enable them to purchase fresh food as well as supplement the stock of non-perishable donated supplies to create nutritious and healthy meal bags which they give to struggling local families throughout summer.	£5,250
St Matthew's Church	This is a registered church organisation, with the welfare of others as it is priority. This funding will enable the purchase food provisions to supplement their supply to feed 50 vulnerable people including families and elderly residents that are referred, through the summer months.	£4,050

Fleet Phoenix	This registered charity offers a variety of services to support young people and families within their communities. This funding will enable them to support 130 households that they serve with food provisions.	£5,500
Vision 4 Youth	This registered charity provides youth club services, supporting families experiencing hardship. This funding will enable the club to run an activity session one evening a week, for young people aged 11-18, providing a meal as well as a safe space to socialise with others over six weeks.	£510
Yateley Industries for the Disabled	The registered charity and community pantry supports Yateley's most vulnerable residents with provisions such as food and essentials. This funding will support more than 300 households, including the elderly, and families with children, with items such as blankets, insulated flasks and slow cookers, in anticipation for the winter.	£3,756

Care and Share Waterlooville	The community group provides provision of emergency food and help packages to people in need. The funding will provide 15 emergency help packages to support 15 households.	£500
Hayling Island Baptist Church, Hayling Holiday Lunches	The registered church organisation, deliver food parcels to families who are struggling on low incomes. This funding would replenish and top up their food resources to enable them to deliver to 75 families during the holidays.	£5,000
Love Your Neighbour Foundation	This church organisation, that has been running a foodbank since the outbreak of Covid 19, is currently supporting 54 families in the PO9 area with the provision of weekly food and essential supplies from their food bank. The funding will enable them to continue supporting these individuals with food provisions for the next six months.	£15,904
Park Community School	The school delivers several projects supporting the most vulnerable in the community support with food and other essentials. This grant will enable Park Community School to continue their support for referred families from across Hampshire with the main beneficiaries coming from Havant area, especially Leigh Park, with the provision of white goods, bedding, and other household essentials for up to 90 households.	£20,000
Portchester Community Association	This registered charity runs a community pantry and hub in Portchester serving the local community. This funding will enable them to support 27 referred families, many of whom are elderly, to repair or replace, white goods, and purchase essentials, such as bedding.	£10,000
Southern Domestic Abuse Service	This registered charity works across Hampshire to provide inclusive services to anyone affected by domestic abuse. They also provide both accommodation and community-based services through the provision of refuge, advice, one-to-one support, and information. The funding will enable them to provide much needed food vouchers to their 92 residential service users, and 100 families living in their own homes across the County over the 6-week school holiday period.	£20,100
Waterlooville Foodbank	This voluntary organisation provides food parcels to an average of 200 of the most vulnerable in the community. This funding will enable the food bank to replenish their stocks and continue providing support for a further six months.	£9,000
Woodcroft pre-school & Wrap Around Care	The school provide early years education and support to those families in need. This funding will support 15 families with food vouchers topping up the school's discretionary grant to reach out to more families in need.	£450

## New Forest

Organisation	Project Summary	Awarded
Meet & Eat Support Group	New Forest Meet & Eat Support Group They are covering the cost of ingredients and materials to run 24 “cook and eat sessions” catering for 10 households a week. It provides an opportunity for the parents to learn how to cook a healthy meal and to share a meal together as a family.	£800
Ringwood Foodbank	They will contribute to replenishing food stocks to meet the 52% increase in demand in the last five months, for up to 600 vulnerable households.	£5,000
Totton and Eling Community Association	They will buy clothes and toiletries to give to vulnerable families referred through healthcare providers and community groups.	£2,000
Youth Options	The registered charity provides services for children and young people, to enable them to improve their futures. The funding will support a minimum of 25 disadvantaged families and up to five care leavers, with hampers containing essentials, such as food vouchers and sanitary products.	£8,000

Frogmore Infant School	To support families with their utility bills.	£300
Rushmoor Healthy Living	This charity supports disadvantaged and vulnerable older adults, BAME communities and those with serious long-term health conditions. It runs an exercise & rehab programme primarily for vulnerable and disadvantaged older adults who struggle to communicate their needs and access support as they have less access to social media and online resources.	£3,990
Vine Centre	The centre, based in Aldershot, provides a broad range of services that address the immediate physical and mental health needs of the most disadvantaged members of the community. The application for funding is to extend the operation and activities run at the Community Café by a further two hours a week to a total of five hours a week for the Silvers Group, vulnerable adults of a pensionable age. Apart from the activities organised, pensioners have access to the pantry, get a hot meal and an opportunity to socialise and have access to support staff to accompany them to GPs appointments.	£9,731
Vine Centre	This charity provides a multitude of services for disadvantaged individuals. This funding will be used to support ‘Kids in the Kitchen’, a weekly cookery course for adults and children to work together staple ingredients from The Vine’s community cupboard. This five-week programme will support up to 144	£1,242

	individuals to take part in this activity that promotes healthy eating and provides a healthy meal for the family.	
Vine Centre	The funding for this project will enable the charity to offer bagged lunches with enough food to provide lunch for a child for a week to those families struggling to afford food over the school holidays. This would cater for up to 100 different children a week, throughout the holidays.	£3,960

### Test Valley

Organisation	Project Summary	Awarded
Alabaré Christian Care & Support	The registered charity provides accommodation and support services for the homeless. The grant funding will enable them to support their clients with food provisions over six months and cover an increase in energy costs for their four accommodations that house up to 33 individuals at any one time.	£12,600
Roman Way Primary School	The school have identified 67 families with children that would benefit from support with meals. The funding will cover the cost of a freezer, toaster and food items to enable the school to offer a breakfast club to these children.	£595
Romsey Community School	The school are looking to provide support to 120 of their most vulnerable families who are on low-income. This grant funding will enable them to provide their families with breakfast parcels, for a three month period over the summer.	£4,950
Romsey Community School (RCS)	This community organisation operates three Community Pantries in Eastleigh, Romsey, and Andover and provides a range of support services to the community. This includes vulnerable older adults who are struggling to communicate support for utility and food due to hearing difficulties and because they have less access to online resources.	£6,066
Unity	Unity is a registered charity working alongside and supporting other organisations and initiatives to deliver their services to support those in need. Unity has large and well-developed allotment which has the potential to be used to provide direct support to 450 households struggling with the rising cost of living. The funding will be used for two projects. The first is to run a Grow Cook and Eat facility for vulnerable households including families with young children as well as older people. Secondly, to supply the three food pantries in the Test Valley with seasonal fruit and vegetables.	£10,832

Carroll Centre	The Carroll Centre is a community anchor organisation and a registered charity that supports children, young people, families, and the wider community. The funding will cover the cost of essential toiletries and hygiene packs that will be given to families attending HAF summer activities. It will also cover the cost of food for 60 children who did not qualify for HAF. Each family will also be encouraged to sign up to their pantry to provide longer term support.	£3,700
Victim Support Hampshire	The charity supports victims across Hampshire who are often financially affected by crime. The funding is to provide food vouchers for up to 140 households where food poverty is evident.	£4,200
Wickham Community Association	This registered charity runs a community pantry alongside various activities and support services for the community. This funding will support the association with food provisions for up to 20 family groups of Ukrainian refugees, and food provision for a further 90 families who attend their holiday 'Stay and Play' sessions.	£3,343

Citizens Advice	The funding is to provide Citizens Advice Hampshire with the capacity to provide access to emergency support for individuals and families across Hampshire who are struggling as a result of the sharp rise in cost of living where the demand for support has escalated since January. Local Citizens Advice are attending weekly outreach sessions across Hampshire to provide food and energy vouchers and grants for heating repairs, white goods, furniture, clothing, rent arrears and other essential support.	£50,000
Citizens Advice East Hampshire	Additional funding to Citizens Advice Service to provide emergency financial support to 400 vulnerable households across Hampshire with fuel bills over the winter period.	£60,000

Home-Start	The charity supports families dealing with a range of challenging circumstances. They provide volunteer-led support to families with young children on a 1:1 basis in their own homes. The funding will contribute to a discretionary hardship fund to provide practical assistance in the form of food and energy vouchers, essential hygiene supplies, warm clothes and bedding for 228 families across Hampshire.	£30,000
UK Harvest Delivery Service	The grant will enable the purchase of fresh food to supplement the stock of rescued and donated food delivered to communities through the winter. This will make the food packs more nutritiously rounded for the 1,900 families served across Hampshire by the organisation.	£5,000
