Hampshire-wide

Organisation	Project Summary	Awarded
Dementia Support Hampshire & IOW	The charity provides support, information, and signposting for anyone affected by dementia residing in Hampshire and the Isle of Wight. This funding will enable the organisation to support 110 households from their client-base with a £50 food voucher, supporting with food provisions over 12 weeks from January.	£7,020
Havant and East Hants Mind	This organisation works in partnership with Citizen’s Advice and other agencies to provides mental health wellbeing services for children, young people, adults, and elderly. This funding	£29,500

	will enable the organisation to support 165 households, identified from their own records, with provisions such as food, white goods, and warm clothes.	
Home-Start Hampshire	Home Start Hampshire will use the grant to target 200 families with children (0-11yrs) to offer support with food and clothing vouchers, provisions such as warm clothes, shoes, and other essentials. This approach also offers interventions to help with budgeting for bills/energy costs as well as access to appliances and white goods.	£30,000
Southern Domestic Abuse Service	This registered charity provides refuge accommodation at 13 sites across Hampshire for women and their children fleeing domestic abuse. This funding will mean that they can provide 120 households or families in refuges, with a £50 food voucher and a £50 energy voucher each and 45 of the most vulnerable households with a further £100 food voucher.	£25,500
The Winchester Beacon (Winchester Churches Night shelter)	This charity provides accommodation and support to people experiencing homelessness in Winchester and across Hampshire. This funding will enable them to provide up to 8 residents with 'Move-on' packages to work directly with their residents to purchase essential items; pay specialist tradespeople; fit curtain poles and/or secure household items like cutlery; kitchen equipment (cookers/fridges) or tools, over a 15 week duration.	£4,000

Organisation	Project Summary	Awarded
Basingstoke Discovery Centre	The Discovery Centre in Basingstoke offers an open community space for those who seek warmth and the opportunity to learn and access books for free. They have requested £1,360 to expand on their provisions to the community and supply a weekly 'brunch bag of food/drink items for 20 households with children, starting on the 12th of December for 16 weeks. These are children from families that have been identified as vulnerable and sign-posted via other agencies such as health visitors.	£1,360
Basingstoke Voluntary Action	This church and registered charity provides support services to the Voluntary, Community and Social Enterprise (VCSE) sector across Basingstoke & Deane. This funding will enhance their 15-week contract with Basingstoke hospital, to support vulnerable patients as they are discharged. It will enable them to provide immediate practical support such as food parcels to an estimated 60 individuals/households.	£4,600
Fellowship Educational Society	Fellowship Education Society will use the grant to provide 50 vulnerable households, including those from ethnic minority backgrounds, migrants and asylum seekers, with fortnightly food packages for a period of two months.	£15,400

Alton Community Cupboard	Community Grub Hub will use the grant to source food from Fareshare to provide up to 170 families on a weekly basis.	£4,000
Alton Lions Club	Alton Community Cupboard will use the grant to collect food from supermarkets and distribute to 400 families.	£5,000
Project Ninety Four	Project Ninety-Four will use the grant to fund a programme of activities, including cooking classes, during the Easter holidays for 25 young people aged 11-16, as well as providing a warm space and hot healthy lunches.	£5,000

New Life Domestic	New Life Domestic will use the grant to provide flooring for 3 households, escaping domestic abuse, to help reduce heating costs and provide a warmer environment for the family.	£10,000
One Community	As a registered charity, One Community seeks to provide voluntary sector support through community development and volunteering in Eastleigh and Fareham. This funding will enable the charity to continue the support they provided from the previous grant rounds to provide fuel vouchers, food, blankets, toiletries, and household repairs/items to 510 of their existing households, including both families with children and the elderly and disabled.	£25,300

Romsey Community Services (RCS)	RCS will use the grant to provide 180 care boxes across their three community pantries plus an additional support of 150 £15 food vouchers to those who require a different type of support to care boxes.	£9,609.50
Youth Options	Youth Options will use the grant to provide food vouchers and a hamper of essential items for 26 households referred through partners.	£7,342.50

Acts of Kindness	Acts of Kindness will use the grant to support 158 vulnerable families through food parcels and a range of small household goods.	£15,185
Growing Places (Community Childcare Centres)	Growing Places will use the grant to support 105 households referred from partners such as Health Visitors, local schools and through the community pantry with household essentials like bedding, electricals, white goods, warm clothing, food & hygiene items, and where appropriate, essential baby items like cots, mattresses, prams, and school uniform.	£6,750
Waypoint Hub	Waypoint will use the grant to provide warm packs (clothing/blankets/heaters/flasks) to 100 vulnerable households in Fareham.	£8,500
Gosport-Feed a Family	This will be used to support 750 households in Gosport through the distribution of warm packs, sanitary products and toiletries as well as sustainable goods for laundry.	£7,500

This funding will allow the organisation to sustain their group session over winter to provide 10 households with provisions such as, a healthy snack, access to further signposting, essential items gifted from local agencies and access to IT equipment to job search etc.	
Jacobs Well	As a registered charity, Jacobs Well provides affordable or free furniture to the public and government agencies. They also run a food bank and a free school uniform project. This funding will allow them to support up to 200 households with warm packs containing blankets and clothing, 50 families with energy vouchers and 100 families with food provisions.	£8,650
North Gosport Parish	North Gosport Parish will use the grant of £4,290 to provide meals and refreshments for groups in their community café and warm space, at St Matthew's Church in Bridgemary. Alongside this they will provide vulnerable households with food vouchers, warm clothing packs and household meal kits, benefitting 145 households in total.	£4,290
Solent Youth Action	Solent Youth Action will use the grant to fund the Routes Waterproof Warmer Project by offering appropriate clothing, hot drinks and food to young people who attend the Routes Skills centre. This will help eighty 11-16 year olds.	£2,240
Empower Global - Family Church (Gosport & Havant)	Empower Global will use the grant to help 163 families with food, utility costs, warm clothes/white goods/toiletries/housing costs.	£20,000.30

Organisation	Project Summary	Awarded
Fleet Phoenix	Fleet Phoenix is a Youth & Community charity based in Fleet, covering the Hart District of Hampshire. They offer a range of services and activities for their youth community including open access youth projects, clubs and services, summer diversionary activities, advice, information, guidance & mentoring & crisis support. They intend to use their requested grant funding to support 95 households who have been identified through their 'Open-door' access, with food provisions and provide a discretionary/emergency fund for fuel support.	£5,100
Hart Voluntary Action	Hart Voluntary Action will use the grant of £6,160 to create and develop its first community project, partnering with local food welfare initiatives in Hart such as the Food Bank, Community Pantry, community larders, through its project 'Minding the Garden'. The community garden offers a fully accessible community space that will facilitate providing free food to the wider community, whilst supporting the mental health and wellbeing of 50 vulnerable households socially and therapeutically.	£6,160
Westside Community Association	Westside Community Association will use the grant to support 469 families through family cooking classes, snuggle & energy bags and bedding, white goods, toiletries, and packs for families with new babies.	£16,720

Care and Share Waterlooville	This voluntary organisation is a not-for-profit Food and Help bank giving assistance to local individuals and families who are suffering from a reduced disposable income and/or poverty. This funding will enable them to replenish their food supplies due to identifying a drop in donations in recent months. This will enable them to support up to 139 households, potentially more as their numbers are increasing.	£1,000
Hayling Island Library	The library provides a warm space and venue for community groups and activities as well as outreach and community support. This funding will enable Hayling Island Library to offer a drop-in venue for families after school hours and provide drinks and snacks. This will enable families to save money on their own heating costs for several hours a week. This will run over the course of ten weeks.	£400
Hayling Holiday Lunches	Hayling House Holiday Lunches through Hayling Island Baptist Church will use the grant to provide 85 food parcels and hampers to vulnerable households with children.	£5,000
Love Your Neighbour Foundation	New Life Christian Church will use the grant of £27,282 to maintain costs and provision for food for the food bank for 123 vulnerable households.	£27,282
Motiv8	Motiv8 will use the grant to supply 20 vulnerable families with supermarket vouchers	£1,000
Park Community School	Park Community School will use the grant funding of £30,700 to distribute 1,100 warm	£30,700

Park Community School	Park Community School delivers the MUNCH food programme including MUNCH Community Pantry, MUNCH Bake house and weekly MUNCH meals at the school, supporting their most vulnerable families and the wider community. This funding will enable them to support 200 households with children in the Leigh Park area, with warm clothing packs, in conjunction with other agencies such as Family Support Service, Homestart and health visitors.	£18,200
