

Consultation on the proposal for a new Resourced Provision for pupils with Social, Emotional and Mental Health (SEMH) needs at Lydlynch Infant School, starting in academic year 2027/28

Lydlynch Infant School and Hampshire County Council would like to hear your views on the proposal to create a Resourced Provision for up to 9 pupils with social, emotional and mental health (SEMH) needs at Lydlynch Infant School opening in phases in the academic year 2027/28.

Children and young people presenting with social, emotional and mental health needs often struggle to manage their emotions and behaviour and can find it difficult to make and keep relationships. It has been identified that there are an increasing number of children in the local area who are being diagnosed with social, emotional and mental health needs and we are therefore working towards expanding our offer of support to these children to attend local schools.

The consultation will run from 22 June – 20 July 2026.

Why do you need to develop a Resourced Provision for pupils with Social Emotional and Mental Health at the school?

Hampshire County Council is committed to meeting the demands of an increasing and growing need to provide specialist support for children with social, emotional and mental health needs in this area of the County is a priority. Hampshire County Council and senior leadership at Lydlynch Infant School are keen to provide this additional provision for pupils and feel this will have a benefit for many pupils at the school. The proposal will add up to 9 pupils on roll at Lydlynch Infant School.

The school are already meeting the needs of pupils with special educational needs and have the site available and leadership expertise to expand this specialist provision to encompass catering for pupils with autism in a safe and secure environment.

What building works will be taking place?

Additional classroom space is required as a base for the Resourced Provision. The school proposes to utilise existing surplus accommodation to become the base for the Resourced Provision - minor adjustments, safeguarding measures, IT and furniture will be required alongside a secure outside play space. Consideration will also be made to staff parking and pupil drop off/pick up and improvements made if required. SEN High Needs Provision capital is available to fund these costs.

When will the building works start and how will you ensure the health and safety of pupils attending the school whilst the works are taking place?

It is planned that the building works, to create the facilities at the Lydlynch Infant School site, will be complete for academic year 2027/28.

Health and safety of children, staff and visitors is paramount. The school would ensure a detailed health and safety plan is drawn up in advance of any works.

What will be the impact on pupils at Lydlynch Infant School?

The pupils who will attend the Resourced Provision will attend mainstream classes as appropriate to suit their needs and also spend time in the Resourced Provision areas for individual and/or small group support.

The new provision will give the opportunity for Lydlynch Infant School to further enhance their inclusion and wellbeing offer to all pupils as this should positively impact pupils across the school and not just those placed in the Resourced Provision. The school will use the funding, facilities and

resources that the Resourced Provision has to benefit both the Resourced Provision pupils and pupils already at the school. Also, the school can access relevant continuous professional development for staff across the school as well as knowledge being shared by staff within the Resourced Provision.

Will the school receive additional funding due to the numbers increasing?

Yes, Lydlynch Infant School will receive additional revenue funding based on the increase in number of pupils on their roll. This will provide the additional staffing and resources required.

What happens after this consultation?

This consultation will run from 22 June - 20 July 2026. Officers will then consider the consultation responses, received in writing, before deciding whether the proposal should continue to the formal publication stage.

If approved, a statutory public notice will be published, setting out the Local Authorities intent to increase the capacity of the school and introduce the new Resourced Provisions. It is anticipated that this will be published in autumn 2026. After the date of publication, there will be a four-week period in which any representations can be made.

After the conclusion of this period, the Local Authority will decide whether to proceed with the proposal. Any final approval will be made in late autumn 2026/Spring 2027.
