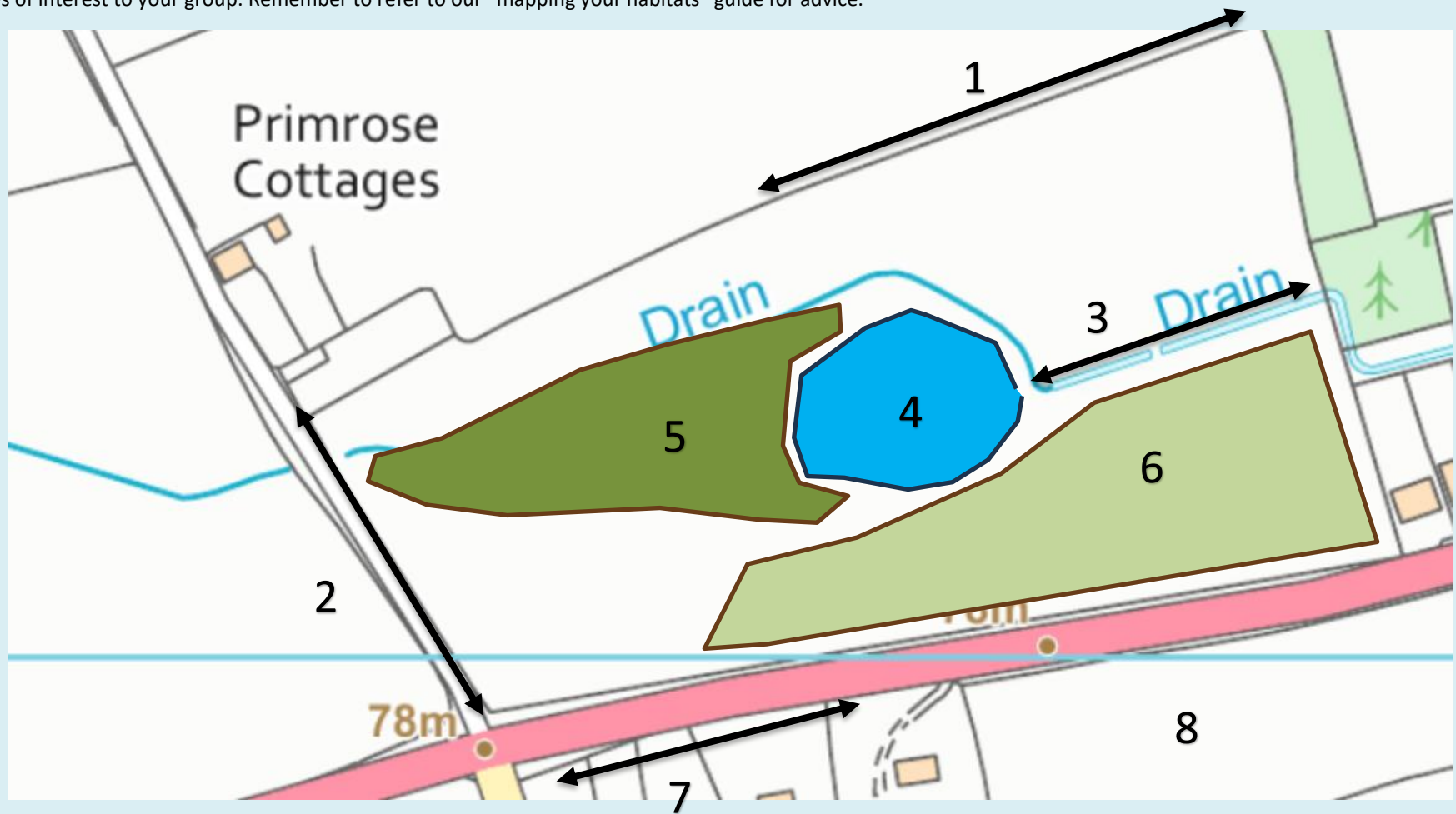


Example of mapping your habitats

Here is a simple example of how you might map your habitats. Its important to remember that the size, variety and distribution of habitats will differ greatly between organisations. Personal preference and the species/ topics of interest may vary between groups too. Therefore, your design may vary significantly. The best thing is to make a start and see how it develops, adding any features of interest to your group. Remember to refer to our “mapping your habitats” guide for advice.



1 – thin hedge with a lot of gaps. Think it's Hawthorn

2 – Thicker hedge (2m tall) several species

3 – seasonal stream, only in wet winters

4 – seasonal pond, only in wetter winters

5 – wet grassland

6 – long grass, lot of nettles

7 – private garden

8 – school grounds
