249. PROJECT EXTRA-CARE: OAK PARK HEALTH AND WELLBEING CAMPUS DEVELOPMENT

1. On the 16 December 2011, the Executive Member for Adult Social Care approved proposals for a development agreement that includes an option to jointly purchase up to 20 reablement beds and an agreement to secure nomination rights for up to 50 Extra-Care Housing units in the proposed Health and Wellbeing Campus.

2. The development of both nursing and reablement beds and Extra-Care housing units on the same site provides residents with the availability of safety of care as well as the support and security these combined developments can provide. In addition, people choosing to live in the Extra-Care housing units will have security of tenure that they do not have in traditional residential care homes. Extra-Care housing also promotes independent living and empowers older people who might have otherwise required residential care.

3. The development will provide excellent health and social care facilities for the residents of Havant and South East Hampshire, providing a high standard of personal accommodation.

250. PRISON SUBSTANCE MISUSE TENDER – HMP WINCHESTER

1. On the 16 January, the Executive Member for Adult Social Care approved going out to tender for an integrated substance misuse service at HMP Winchester.

2. The Government has stated that the separate contracts for substance misuse treatment and support in prisons should be integrated into single contracts reflecting community recovery-orientated services. The commission will occur through the Drug Alcohol Action Team (DAAT), which sits with Hampshire County Council.

3. The contract shall cover many elements including a first night medical check and access to peer support and mutual aid. The contract will run for 30 months from the 1 October 2012 until 31 March 2015 with an optional extension period not exceeding two years. This would bring the project in line with any potential national direction over Payment by Results (PbR)

251. EXTRA-CARE HOUSING TENDERING AND PROCUREMENT

1. On the 16 January 2012, the Executive Member for Adult Social Care approved to go out to tender for care and support for Enhanced Extra Care Housing at both Place Court and St Johns. This follows on from Extra-Care Housing report approved by Cabinet on 24 September 2007.

2. The two schemes are in Rushmoor and currently provide standard sheltered housing, which will become part of the network of enhanced extra-care housing. The schemes form part of the completion of the Phase 1 Extra-Care programme and the tendering process will see contracts issued from April 2013.

252. PROGRESSING THE OLDER PERSONS MENTAL HEALTH STRATEGY IN HAMPSHIRE: DEMENTIA ADVISOR SERVICES

1. On the 16 January 2012, the Executive Member for Adult Social Care gave approval to go out to tender for a county wide Dementia Advisor Service using part funding from Hampshire Primary Care Trust (PCT)

2. The decision was taken following “Living Well With Dementia – A National Dementia Strategy” published in February 2009, which set out a vision for transforming services to achieve better awareness, early diagnosis and higher quality treatment. It builds on the experience gained from having a pilot scheme in Andover

3. In taking forward this service, Hampshire County Council and the NHS are recognising the need for advanced quality treatment and accessible and high quality information for sufferers of dementia, their family and their carers.
