## 1. Summary

1.1. The purpose of this report is to seek approval for the proposed level of Harbour Dues for 2012. It is recommended that no overall increase is imposed, and that the final stage of the five-year equalisation process be implemented.

## 2. Harbour Dues 2012

- 2.1. The approved budget for 2011/12 generates a planned surplus of £18,800.
- 2.2. A decision not to increase the level of Harbour Dues for 2012 would leave annual income from this source unchanged. Expenditure could increase in line with the Retail Prices Index (RPI) which is currently in excess of 5%, but a significant proportion of Harbour Authority expenditure is on staff, for whom salaries are currently frozen. The net result of this and the projected surplus is that there is no compelling argument for an increase in Harbour Dues income for 2012.
- 2.3. If this proposal is accepted, the impact on individual Harbour Dues payers will vary, because of the phasing-in of the equalisation process approved by the Harbour Board in 2007. The phasing period is five years and ends in 2012. The effect is that the rates for marina based craft and dry-sailors will increase, whilst the rates for most categories of mid-stream moorings will reduce.
- 2.4. The Harbour Dues proposed are shown in the table below. It should be noted that the Dues are shown inclusive of VAT at 20% and rates are per metre of length overall (LOA), or part thereof.
