




Years ago our neighbour had all the care proposed in your 'new model' but when his wife could no longer cope they were both comforted by his admission to the Chase to die. I have visited friends and neighbours in the Chase Hospital often in the last ten years. For successful rehabilitation following emergency admissions to Basingstoke and for end of life care, the service offered by the Chase has been excellent, compassionate and effective. The major hospitals are all at least 20 miles away and for Bordon and Whitehill residents who struggle to get anywhere on public transport the service provided by the Chase is extremely important. I have no faith in the promise of similar care in a nursing home in Liss. If we lose the beds at the Chase then I foresee painful and lonely end of life trauma in Basingstoke or elsewhere for people living here. The beds should be retained. The documentation says that those who stayed in the Chase could have been cared for elsewhere more cost effectively. I don't believe that this is right - if alternative care were clinically advisable or possible then that care would have been arranged by the doctors and other care workers concerned.
