- a) That approval is given for Froxfield CEC Infant School to alter the upper age limit of the school to become a primary school with effect from 1 September 2013.

#### 2. Reason(s) for the decision:

- 2.1. Following local consultation the governing body published a Public Notice to alter the upper age limit of the school to become a primary school with effect from 1 September 2013.
- 2.2. The Public Notice was published on 5 September 2012. A number of comments and objections were received as set out in the report.
- 2.3. A copy of the Public Notice and the complete proposals are appended. The governing body complied with all statutory requirements relating to the publication of the Public Notice.
- 2.4. The reason for making this decision is to give parents of Froxfield children a choice to send their children to a primary school within the village and to ensure the viability of the school for the future together with the increasing difficulty of securing a Year 3 place in neighbouring primary schools.
