

School specific criteria for inclusion in Primary school policies for 2013-2014

Primary Schools	Comments
Crondall Primary	*Out-catchment distance measured to catchment area boundary.
Fleet Infant School	*In-catchment children living north of the railway line have priority over other in-catchment applicants (distance).
Fryern Junior (federated with Fryern Infant)	*Children who at the time of application attend Fryern Infant School. - criteria 3A & 5A .
Gomer Junior	Children who at the time of application attend Gomer Infant School – criterion 5A
Great Binfields Primary	*If the school is oversubscribed from within any of the oversubscription criteria, walking distance will be used to prioritise applications; applicants living nearer the school have priority. Walking distance means the shortest walking route from home to the nearer of two gates to the entrance of the school, using public roads and footpaths.
Herne Junior	*Six children leaving Year 2 of Froxfield CE Infant School and who live in the catchment area of that school may be admitted over the published admission number into Year 3. <i>There is no linked junior school for Froxfield CE Infant School.</i>
Leesland Junior (federated with Leesland Infant)	*Children who at the time of application attend Leesland Infant School. - criteria 3A & 5A .
Liphook Junior	Children who at the time of application attend Liphook Infant School – criterion 5A
Manor Junior	Children who at the time of application attend Manor Infant School – criterion 5A
Medstead CE Primary	*Out-catchment children living within the wider parish of Medstead on the eastern side of Boyneswood Road (commencing from the railway bridge) and the cul-de-sacs, to be given priority over other out-catchment children without relevant siblings.
Merdon Junior	Children who at the time of application attend Chandlers Ford Infant School. – criteria 3A & 5A
Newport Junior (federated with Belle Vue Infant)	*Children who at the time of application attend Belle Vue Infant School. - criteria 3A & 5A
Nursling CE Primary	*CTE – Churches Together in England – oversubscription criteria 3B & 5B
Oakley Junior	Children who at the time of application attend Oakley Infant School – criterion 5A
Parsonage Farm Nursery & Infant School	*Criterion 5 . Children living out of catchment who have a sibling on the roll of the school.
Peel Common Junior	Children who at the time of application attend Peel Common Infant School – criterion 5A
Purbrook Junior	Children who at the time of application attend Purbrook Infant School. – criteria 3A & 5A
Ranvilles Junior	Children who at the time of application attend Ranvilles Infant School – criterion 5A
Ringwood Junior	*Measurement by “walking distance”.
Rownhams St John CE Primary	*CTE – Churches Together in England – criteria 3B & 5B

Sarisbury Infant	*Priority for children living in the Whiteley Primary School catchment with a sibling on roll at Sarisbury Infant or junior school – oversubscription criterion 5 .
Sarisbury CE Junior School	*Priority for children living in the Whiteley Primary School catchment with a sibling on roll at Sarisbury Infant or junior school - oversubscription criterion 5 .
St James' CE Primary Emsworth	*CTE – Churches Together in England – oversubscription criteria 3B & 5B
Saint James' CE Primary, West End	*Out-catchment children living in Nelsons Gardens, Peppercorn Way, Adams Close, Arthurs Close, Terrier Close and Wainwright Gardens, (previously part of Saint James' CE Primary School's catchment area), who have a sibling who will still be attending the school in September 2011 and who was admitted to the school when their address was still within the catchment area, will be treated as catchment siblings.
St John the Baptist CE Primary, Titchfield	*Applications from children living in the catchment area of Whiteley Primary School will have catchment status for the purposes of home to school transport entitlement. CTE – Churches Together in England – oversubscription criteria 3B and 5B .
Velmead Junior	*In-catchment children living north of the railway line have priority over other in-catchment applicants (distance).
Weyford Junior	Children who at the time of application attend Weyford Infant School – criterion 5A

School specific criteria for inclusion in Secondary school policies for 2013-2014

Secondary Schools	Comments
Brookfield	*Within oversubscription criterion 4, priority is given to children living in Warsash to the south of the school (meaning that they do not have to go past Brookfield on their way to an alternative school).
Cranbourne	*For children living within Oakley and surrounding district of the catchment area (*), the distance will be measured as a straight line from home to the nearest college bus stop. The designated bus pick up points are Newfound: The Fox, East Oakley: Avon Road/Itchen Close, Marlborough Gardens, Oakley Lane, Croft Road, St John's Piece West, Pack Lane / Lightsfield and Oakley: Oakley Primary Schools, Oakley Pond, Hill Road/Barn Lane, Hill Road/St John's Road, Breach Farm Turn. (* Please contact the college to view a map of the surrounding area.)
Robert Mays	*In the event that the school oversubscribes in the 'out-catchment with a sibling' criterion those attending a linked school will be given priority. Distance from the school will then be used to order the list
Vyne	*For children living in the Chineham detached catchment area, distance measurement will be from home to the main bus stop on Mattock Way.
Wavell	*Out-catchment distances measured to catchment area boundary. The school lies on the southern edge of its catchment. This criterion will enhance the admission chances of out of catchment pupils attending linked schools to the north of the area.
