CCRA SC	Continuing to monitor developments as a result of recommendations made from the Light Touch Reviews undertaken in 2011 (Allocation of Grants and Income Generation). Continuing to monitor developments in Library Service and Museums & Arts Service through the formal committee meetings including pre-scrutiny of key decisions. Additional Meeting convened in September to pre scrutinise museums service potential merger decision.											
C&YP SC	The committee met in June 2013 and received presentations about the scope of its remit. Members were invited to email their suggestions for future work items and these will be considered by the Chairman at the end of July.

E&T SC	<p>Task and Finish Group began in 2012 looking at the Grass Verge, Footpath and Pavement parking policy, which has been reviewed and updated by the Department. This will form part of the Highway Maintenance Management Plan the committee is due to pre-scrutinise at the November 2013 meeting. A Working Group also took place in late 2012/early 2013 regarding the A3 Zip Bus Priority Corridor, and the Department has undertaken a number of actions as a result. A Motion about Fracking was referred to this committee from County Council - the background to this issue is due to be covered at a briefing for committee Members in September, with the committee to debate the issue at its November meeting and report back to November Council. The committee will also be holding a Flooding scrutiny event in November.</p>				
P&R SC	<p>Recommendation that Select Committee Chairmen attend meetings discussing the budget prior to the January Select Committee meetings accepted and acted on in December 2012. Topics scrutinised at committee meetings include corporate performance, economic development, management of sickness absence and consultation. Considered Motion regarding the Call In process referred from full Council (October 2012).</p>				
S&HP SC	<p>The Committee met for the first time under the new administration in June 2013, where it was agreed that the July meeting would be deferred to September, in order to allow for the work programme to be shaped over the summer. Currently the work-programme has rolled over from that agreed by the previous membership of the Committee.</p>				
HOSC	<p>Chairman has continued to meet with key contacts between meetings, such as commissioners and providers regarding items coming up for the HOSC, including making contact with Clinical Commissioning Group Chairs. Proposals for service changes at Chase Community Hospital were approved in March following scrutiny over a number of meetings, the Committee will begin monitoring the implementation of these in July, alongside evaluating changes to Adult Mental Health services. Committee has continued to respond to national consultations, and will be briefed on the outcome of the Independent Reconfiguration Panel's review of the children's congenital heart surgery review. Committee will re-form AMH working group in Summer to look at Section 136 detainments in Hampshire, following a recent national review.</p>
