

E&T SC	<p>The committee is due to pre scrutinise the collated highway maintenance policies in the Highway Maintenance Management Plan and the collated Traffic Management Policies at the November 2013 meeting. A Motion about Fracking was referred to this committee from County Council - the background to this issue was covered at a briefing for committee Members in September, with the committee to debate the issue at its November meeting and report back to November Council. The November meeting will also be considering the Household Waste Recycling Centres Strategy. The committee will be holding a Flood Risk Management scrutiny oral evidence session on 9 December (following a flood risk conference hosted by ETE Dept in the morning). Stakeholders have been contacted to provide written evidence ahead of the event. Consideration of the performance monitoring of the Term Highway Contract is scheduled for the Spring meeting.</p>				
P&R SC	<p>In July the committee was briefed on the Performance context and financial context for the County Council, and priority corporate policy areas for the coming year. Topics on the agenda for the October committee meeting include refreshed corporate priorities, partnership working, sickness absence rates and corporate consultation guidance.</p>				
S&HP SC	<p>A new work programme has now been agreed by the Committee. In September, the Committee considered an item on the Care Bill, and agreed to form a working group to review the County's response to and proposed implementation of elements of the Bill.</p> <p>The Committee will be pre-scrutinising the EM for Adult Services' decision on the closure of four care homes and one day centre in November.</p>				

HOSC	<p>Chairman has continued to meet with key contacts between meetings, such as commissioners and providers regarding items coming up for the HOSC, including making contact with Clinical Commissioning Group Chairs and providing development sessions to NHS organisations on substantial change.</p> <p>Committee has most recently monitored changes to adult mental health services and Chase Community Hospital, as well as receiving items on Child and Adolescent Mental Health Services and an update on the progress on national reviews. The Committee most recently considered proposals to move wellbeing services in North East Hampshire, and agreed that they were not substantial in nature.</p> <p>Substantial future items on the HOSC work programme are proposals for the future provision of services across the Hampshire Hospitals NHS FT site, and service specification-led commissioning of specialised services (include vascular).</p>				
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
