

REPORT OF THE
Hampshire Fire and Rescue Authority
PART II

59. PRINCE'S TRUST

1. The Fire Authority at its meeting on 3 December 2013 received and noted a presentation on the scope and nature of the Prince's Trust programmes and in particular on the relationship between the Trust and the Fire and Rescue Service.

2. It was explained that delivery already covered a number of areas around Hampshire and it was hoped that this could be expanded further. Joint work with the Health and Wellbeing programme was detailed and it was confirmed that adaptations had been made to respond to the raised participation age and the needs of the Department for Education. In particular the value of the work of the Trust to the community and to a range of partner organisations was emphasised.

3. The Fire Authority welcomed the work of the Prince's Trust and was supportive of the delivery role played by the Fire and Rescue Service. Particular recognition was given to the officers leading the programme for its high success rate.

60. PRIMARY AUTHORITY SCHEME

1. The Authority considered the report of the Chief Officer and endorsed the active participation of Hampshire Fire and Rescue Service in delivering the Primary Authority Scheme (PAS).

2. Members heard about the background to PAS, including the piloting role played by HFRS in its development. A number of details relating to the implementation and functionality of the Scheme, especially regarding instances of cross boundary working, the relationship with other Fire and Rescue services and the potential for cost recovery were discussed. It was confirmed that from April 2014 the PAS would become a national requirement.
