



<b>C&amp;YP SC</b>	<p>In January 2014 the committee considered the revenue budget for 2014/15 and due to concerns regarding the proposed reduced funding for short breaks for disabled children from 2014/15, established a task and finish group to understand the existing activities and consider the potential impact on children and their families. The task and finish group has held six meetings and received a number of reports from officers, as well as delegations from Hampshire Parent/Carer Network, a number of voluntary sector representatives and young people themselves. In scrutinising this information, the group produced and considered a wide range of ideas and posed a number of detailed questions. The Group has identified a number of recommendations which will be submitted to the Select Committee for consideration in July. At the July meeting, the Select committee will also receive a report on school nursing, the annual report of Hampshire Ethnic Minority and Traveller Achievement Service (EMTAS) and consider it's proposed work programme for the remainder of the year.</p>				
<b>ETE SC</b>	<p>The committee scrutinised Flood Risk Management in late 2013, with the findings and recommendations agreed by the committee at the April 2014 meeting. The Executive Member and DEFRA accepted the recommendations, their responses were considered by the committee at their July meeting, and the committee resolved to hold a follow up session dedicated to flood risk scrutiny in future. At the April meeting the committee pre scrutinised significant decisions regarding the Term Highway Contract and the Waste Strategy. As a result the Select Committee will be initiating two task &amp; finish groups on the Highways Service on new ways of working to be trialled during the extension of the current contract, and options being considered for when the current contract comes to an end. The committee has also established a working group on the Local Enterprise Partnerships and Local Growth Funding which will be reporting back to the full committee at future meetings.</p>				
<b>P&amp;R SC</b>	<p>The committee held it's April meeting at Havant Plaza to focus on partnership working and the pilot work being undertaken in Havant in conjunction with the Borough Council to improve joined up working in public services and provision of services in local communities. The committee will be continuing to monitor this work over the coming year. At the July meeting the committee will be considering the outcomes of the Working Group established to consider a corporate approach to how the County Council consults.</p>				

<b>HASC</b>	<p>New Committee has now been set up and is due to meet for the first time at the end of July. A draft work programme has been agreed by the Chairman and Vice Chairman for ratification at the first meeting.</p> <p>HASC members have attended an informal briefing on Supporting People, which is due for pre-decision scrutiny at the July meeting, and welfare reform, which is likely to be reviewed by P&amp;R SC. An induction session on health scrutiny, social care and public health has also been provided to members.</p> <p>The Care Act working group continues to meet to shape the Council's response to this legislation, and the Section 136 working group is due to table its final report at the July meeting.</p>
