1. Summary

- 1.1. This report summarises the incidents and events in the Harbour from 18 July 2014. Any incidents or events which take place after this report is distributed will be the subject of a separate Annex to be circulated at the meeting. A summary of incidents which occurred in the period between the previous Management Committee meeting (27 June 2014) and Harbour Board meeting (18 July 2014) is at Appendix 1.

2. Patrols

- 2.1. The harbour has been patrolled by the Duty Harbour Master at various times between 0800 and 2000 Sunday to Thursday and 0630 and 2230 Friday and Saturday.

3. Incidents and events

- 3.1 24 July. Report of dinghy stolen a boatyard. Police informed.
- 3.2 24 July. Several instances of youths swimming from Hamble Jetty, culminating in a reported near-miss between a swimmer and a yacht.
- 3.3 25 July. Patrol assisted a small motor boat with engine problems. Towed to slipway for recovery.
- 3.4 25 July. Report of near-miss between a yacht and a fishing vessel near No. 7 pile.
- 3.5 26 July. Patrol assisted a motorboat with engine failure. Towed to Warsash slipway.
- 3.6 27 July. Patrol assisted a vessel with engine problems. Towed to Warsash slipway.

- 3.7 28 July. Patrol attended a vessel which was being held down by its pile lines. On inspection, it was found that the lines had been secured around the pile rather than being shackled to the pile ring.
- 3.8 29 July. Patrol discovered a moored yacht at risk of sinking. Patrol gained access in order to identify the source of the leak and pumped out. Owner informed.
- 3.9 2 Aug. Patrol assisted a yacht which had an injured skipper and engine problems.
- 3.10 5 Aug. Report of small motor boat stolen from a boatyard. Recovered later the same day from a nearby marina.
- 3.11 8 Aug. Patrols on duty until 2330 to monitor vessels returning from Cowes Week Fireworks. No significant incidents.
- 3.12 10 Aug. Report of a tender stolen from a marina. Recovered later the same day from a nearby boatyard.
- 3.13 10 Aug. Report of collision between a moving yacht and a moored vessel. Owners details exchanged.
- 3.14 12 Aug. Patrol assisted a sailing dinghy with four persons onboard with broken forestay. Dinghy towed back to Hamble slipway.
- 3.15 17 Aug. Patrol assisted a yacht with engine problems to berth at Warsash. During this manoeuvre, a member of the yacht's crew attempted to jump onto the pontoon and fell overboard. He was rescued by the Patrol.
- 3.16 18 Aug. Patrol rescued a sinking RIB which had been beached on Hook Spit. RIB re-floated and escorted to safety.
- 3.17 22 Aug. Patrol responded to a report of a significant diesel spill from a motor yacht refuelling at Port Hamble. The marina had deployed absorbent booms but some fuel had escaped and this was broken up as much as possible with propellers. The Coastguard was informed of the incident. The Harbour Master and a marine engineer investigated the cause of the spill but could find no obvious explanation.

IMPACT ASSESSMENTS:

1. Equality Duty

APPENDIX 1

Incident and Event supplement (Management Committee only)

The following incidents and events occurred during the period 27 June and 18 July 2014:

- 1.1 28 June. The Annual Harbour Master's Pursuit Race for dinghies was held, with the assistance of the River Hamble Combined Clubs. 34 dinghies took part and £170 was raised for the Ellen MacArthur Cancer Trust.
- 1.2 29 June. Patrol responded to reports of a small inflatable being blown out of the River with two persons on board.
- 1.3 5 July. Patrol responded to a request for assistance from the skipper of a yacht with a rope round its propeller. The yacht was helped onto a safe berth.
- 1.4 6 July. An injured yachtswoman was brought into the River and landed at Hamble, contrary to standard procedure. Ambulance and para-medics were waiting at Warsash. Patrol conveyed para-medical to Hamble where they were met by an ambulance. Coastguard notified regarding breach of procedure.
- 1.5 9 July. Patrol notified by Police of children swimming from Hamble Jetty. Patrol remained in attendance for over an hour but had no powers of enforcement in this situation.
- 1.6 12 July. The River Hamble Games were held without incident.
- 1.7 12 July. A yachtsman (not connected with the Games) with a head injury was landed at Warsash Jetty – ambulance and doctor attended.
- 1.8 12 July. Patrol attended a request for help from a mooring holder who was stranded on the mud with a deflated dinghy. The mooring holder and his dinghy were reunited with dry land.
- 1.9 17 July. Patrol responded to a request from the Coastguard to provide a tow to a French yacht which had lost its propeller. In the event, the yacht was able to sail alongside a marina finger berth whilst the Patrol stood by.
