



<p><b>C&amp;YP SC</b></p>	<p>In January 2014 the committee considered the revenue budget for 2014/15 and due to concerns regarding the proposed reduced funding for short breaks for disabled children from 2014/15, established a task and finish group to understand the existing activities and consider the potential impact on children and their families. The task and finish group identified a number of recommendations which were consideration by the Committee in July and recommendations forwarded to the Executive Lead Member for consideration. During August, a quorum of Members requested the Committee to exercise it's call-in powers in respect of a decision by the Executive Lead Member for Children's Services to consult on changes to the delivery programme for short breaks for disabled children. Therefore a special meeting was convened on 12 September 2014 to consider the call-in request and the Committee resolved not to request the Executive Lead Member to reconsider his decision. The consultation is now underway and the Committee at it's meeting in January 2015 will pre-scrutinise the Executive Lead Member's decision following analysis of the consultation responses. At the September meeting, the Committee received information from the commissioner, provider and watchdog of services for child and adolescent mental health, an update on the planning of school places to meet increasing demand and the detailed results of the recent Ofsted inspection of Children's Services.</p>				
<p><b>ETE SC</b></p>	<p>In July 2014 the Select Committee initiated two task &amp; finish groups on the Highways Service: on new ways of working to be trialled during the extension of the current contract, and options being considered for when the current contract comes to an end. Both have held their first meetings, and are due to report to the full committee in early 2015. The committee has also established a working group on the Local Enterprise Partnerships and Local Growth Funding which will be reporting back to the full committee at future meetings. At the October 2014 meeting the committee will be pre scrutinising significant Executive decisions on the waste contract and passenger transport.</p>				
<p><b>P&amp;R SC</b></p>	<p>The committee held it's April meeting at Havant Plaza to focus on partnership working and the pilot work being undertaken in Havant in conjunction with the Borough Council to improve joined up working in public services and provision of services in local communities. The committee will be continuing to monitor this work over the coming year. At the July meeting the committee supported the recommendations of the Working Group established to consider a corporate approach to how the County Council consults, which have been sent on to the Leader. Over the summer the Chairman has been meeting with relevant Department Directors to inform the future work programme.</p>				

<b>HASC</b>	<p>The HASC has now met twice in July and September, and has considered several temporary closures of services, as well as ongoing substantial changes of service, and monitoring previous issues. A work programme has been agreed which incorporates issues from health, adult social care and public health.</p> <p>The Care Act working group continues to meet to shape the Council's response to this legislation. The Adult Mental Health Section 136 working group has now reported, producing a final set of recommendations for the NHS, county council, police and Health and Wellbeing Board. This working group has now disbanded. A new working group on Supporting People services is being set up, with terms of reference due to be agreed by P&amp;R SC in October. This group will focus on reviewing evidence relating to future executive member recommendations on the future of supporting people services in Hampshire.</p>
