It plans to have the final pieces presented at the Theatre Royal. The project will give the participants insight into the arts and museums world, broadening their experience and interests. The resulting pieces of work will also be available for others to share and experience. Both companies meet weekly at Wildern School, Hedge End, create 3 works and tour on average 18 shows per year. There are 15 members of FuzzyLogic and 12 members of FuzzyVision. Some elements of this application may be seen as running costs rather than a distinct project and the organisation has applied for more than the project shortfall. The organisation has committed £1,000 of its own funds to the project, secured £1,000 from the Esmee Fairbairn Foundation and £600 from Rotary Eastleigh.
