Hampshire London 2012 Legacy - The Pyramid - Actions

The Hampshire Talented Athlete Scheme Funding has been increased to £92,000 a year for each year up to the 2016 Rio Games. Approximately 250 athletes a year will benefit from this increase

The Hampshire Institute of Sport – supporting talent development in the county. A plan to establish a formal partnership between the Local Authorities, Universities, the Military & Hampshire businesses to provide a high quality structure of support for sporting talent in Hampshire

To stage a major sporting event in Hampshire – plans are underway to hold a stage of the Tour of Britain in the county during 2016 & 2018. This is the biggest 'free to watch' event in the UK

Hampshire Legacy Makers – Team Hampshire – a team of approx. 2,000 sports volunteers to include London 2012 Games Makers & Sport Makers. To create a team of volunteers for a range of sports events, to organise, assist and marshal throughout the year

Adult Services- Ping Pong programme for senior citizens with a competition in October 2014

CCBS/Childrens Services – The Hampshire Extreme Games – Calshot 2014/15 for schools

CCBS – The River Hamble Games 2014. Even to be held every 2 years. Water based sports

CCBS – Countryside – use of CPs for physical activity – Lepe into Action, Fitness trail at Lymington/Keyhaven, Staunton CP walking & cycle routes, New Forest health walks, Rights of Way routes marked, QCEP starter orienteering courses

Childrens Services – schools Road to Rio – Schools challenge pupils to participate in an hour of physical activity a week up to Rio 2016 'Re kindle the flame' workshops for schools on legacy & raising attainment
Resources for Schools on using the values for world sporting events.
Hampshire TV significant increase in the resources available.
Hampshire Hopefuls – extending the reading project.
Creating a Culture of Physical activity in primary schools

Public Health – The Physical Activity Plan, walking, developing a walking strategy for the county

CCBS -London 2012 Legacy awards – supporting volunteering projects in the county inspired by the Games

CCBS -Paralympic sport – wheelchair rugby, wheelchair racing, Goal ball, Disability Coaching Network A Disability/Para Games

CCBS - Hampshire Athletics Saucony GPs – developing 2 high quality athletics events in the county

PE & Sport premium (£9,000)

Conditions of grant Sept 2015

To develop and add to provision

Demonstrate impact – attainment in PE & other areas of the curriculum

Ofsted can & will withdraw money if not used as intended

Lack of physical activity greater in children

Only 21% of boys & 16% of girls aged 5 – 15 are achieving 60 mins a day

Girls being put off PE as early as 8 years old

Worse for very young children

Only 9% of boys & 10% of girls aged 2 – 4 meet Chief Medical Officers guidelines



The Road to Rio Legacy Challenge for Schools

2016 minutes of extra physical activity
between now & the Rio Games

Could be a term, year etc. – Schools could
decide how to distribute the time

Children get a score card stamped

Gold, Silver & Bronze certificates awarded

Institute for Youth Sport /Loughborough University Survey– May 2012

- 12% of 14 year old girls reaching recommended levels of physical activity
- 45% of girls said ‘sport was too competitive’
- 48% of girls said ‘getting sweaty is not feminine’
- 43% said there ‘aren’t many sporting role models for girls’
- School is seen as the key location where attitudes to sport & physical activity are formed
