

C&YP SC	<p>The Committee met in September in order to review the 'Transformation to 2017' proposals, as well as details on recent SEN reforms, and in October to consider planning for the new Standing Advisory Council for Religious Education (SACRE) schools syllabus, an overview of the Ethnic Minority and Traveller Achievement service, and secondary school place planning.</p> <p>It next meets in January in order to review revenue and capital budgets, details of the recommissioning of Child and Adolescent Mental Health services, public health in schools, and home schooling.</p>				
ETE SC	<p>The committee has held a Task & Finish Group on the Parish Lengthsman Scheme, which reported its findings to the October 2015 meeting of the Select Committee and recommendations have been made to the Executive Member for ETE. At the September 2015 meeting the committee reviewed the 'transformation to 2017' proposals and consultation feedback for ETE Department services. At the October meeting the committee reviewed the 2015 changes in HWRC opening hours, considered the role of the Council in reducing animal casualties on roads in the New Forest, and received an update on plans for further consultation on ETE savings areas under 'transformation to 2017'. The Select Committee will be pre-scrutinising savings proposals affecting highways maintenance at the January 2016 meeting.</p>				
P&R SC	<p>The Committee considered the transformation to 2017 budget savings and public consultation feedback at the September 2015 meeting and made a recommendation to the Executive Member that further consideration be given to the proposed reduction in member grants budgets. The committee maintains oversight of the work taking place across the other scrutiny committees. The Committee will be covering the crime and disorder scrutiny duty at the November 2015 meeting. The committee has established a sub committee to consider applications for large grants under the community buildings fund, which will be meeting in early March 2016. The committee will be considering the annual update on IT issues including an update on the digital strategy, at the January 2016 meeting.</p>				
HASC	<p>The HASC continues to meet six times a year, and has recently considered several temporary closures of services, as well as ongoing substantial changes of service, and is monitoring previous issues. A work programme has been agreed which incorporates issues from health, adult social care and public health. The main focus of the Committee over the coming months are issues related to systems resilience and out of hospital care, as well as contributions to a Joint HOSC on the Dorset clinical services review, vascular services and health and social care services for north and mid Hampshire.</p>
