1. Summary

1.1. This report covers the issues currently under consideration by the Marine Director.

2. Warsash Slipway

2.1. Works to effect the planned improvements commenced on 16 November and are due to complete by 18 December. The slipway remained open to use except for a short period at Low Water between 23-25 November, when matting was laid at the lower reach.

3. Tenders and Access to Mid-Stream Moorings

3.1. In response to concerns regarding the continued availability of tender berths in the River, the Authority is investigating, alongside interested parties, the means of safeguarding and improving access to mid stream moorings.

4. Deputy Harbour Master

4.1. Wendy Stowe will leave the Harbour Authority in January after 18 years' service to take up her new position as the Harbour Master at Beaulieu. Wendy will be the only serving lady Harbour Master in the country. I should like to record a vote of thanks for her efforts here and wish her every success in the future.
