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## 1. Summary

- 1.1. This report summarises activities relating to the River Hamble Harbour Authority's (RHHA) environmental management of the Hamble Estuary from November 2015 to February 2016.

## 2. Updates

- 2.1. The Environment & Development Manager (EDM) achieved a renewed certificate in oil spill management in January 2016. Holders of this qualification are required to repeat the training every 3 years in line with the Maritime & Coastguard Agency's (MCA) requirements for oil spill response and preparedness. The Harbour Master and new Deputy Harbour Master are due to undertake oil spill training in Spring 2016.
- 2.2. The EDM conducted an oil spill notification exercise in December with Adler & Allan (RHHA's Tier 2 response contractor) as required by the MCA. A test of call out procedures and potential for staff deployment was undertaken. Adler & Allan have relocated to a depot based in Hamble and as such deployment can now be within an hour from callout.
- 2.3. The EDM's role extends to that of Officer of the Hamble Estuary Partnership (HEP). As such, the EDM and Chairman of the HEP attended the national Coastal Partnership Network conference in November. This was a valuable opportunity for all coastal partnerships to network, receive updates from government organisations, share best practice and to feed a national voice for coastal issues to government ministers via the CPN Chair. 2.4. A meeting of the Hamble Estuary Partnership was held on 8th December 2015:

- A presentation was given on two related projects aimed at mitigating the impacts of both human recreation and of coastal defence projects upon internationally important bird populations in the Solent.
- The Marine Management Organisation provided an update on progress of the South Marine Plan, and demonstrated some of the useful planning tools available online. A public consultation on the draft plan will be held over Spring/Summer 2016 and Plan adoption is due early 2017.
- Each HEP member gave an update on their organisation's work that is relevant to the Hamble Estuary.

2.5. The EDM held an interim meeting in January with consultancy AHTI regarding progress of the Hamble sediment management project. AHTI consultants, the EDM and Marine Director also attended site meetings with landowners of three privately owned saltmarsh areas in the River to gain further understanding of site features, function and history. The landowners remain fully engaged and supportive of the objectives of the project. The project is on track to deliver its report in early May 2016.
