**269. BROADCASTING ANNOUNCEMENT**

The Chairman announced that the meeting was being recorded for broadcast on the County Council's website and would be available for repeated viewing. The press and members of the public were also permitted to film and broadcast this meeting. Those remaining at the meeting were consenting to being filmed and recorded, and to the possible use of those images and recording broadcasting purposes.

**270. APOLOGIES FOR ABSENCE.**

Apologies for absence were received from Councillors Jon Bennison, Adrian Collett, Ray Finch, Jane Frankum, Chris Greenwood, Marge Harvey, Edward Heron, Martin Lyon, Frank Rust, Tom Thacker, Ken Thornber CBE, Malcolm Wade and Sharyn Wheale. Apologies were also received from Honorary Aldermen Patricia Banks, Phryn Dickens and Marilyn Tucker.

**271. DECLARATIONS OF INTEREST.**

Members were mindful that where they believed they had a Disclosable Pecuniary Interest in any matter considered at the meeting they must declare that interest and, having regard to Part 3, Paragraph 1.5 of the County Council's Members' Code of Conduct, leave the meeting while the matter was discussed, save for exercising any right to speak in accordance with Paragraph 1.6 of the Code. Furthermore Members were mindful that where they believed they had a Personal Interest in a matter being considered at the meeting they considered, having regard to Part 5, Paragraph 4 of the Code, whether such interest should be declared, and having regard to Part 5, Paragraph 5 of the Code, considered whether it was appropriate to leave the meeting while the matter was discussed, save for exercising any right to speak in accordance with the Code.

**272. MINUTES.**

The minutes of the meeting of the County Council held on 21 July 2016 were confirmed as a correct record and signed by the Chairman.

Matters arising:

Councillor Tony Hooke requested an update in regard to information previously requested in relation to Minute 267 – Annual Report of the Health and Social Care Select Committee.

**273. DEPUTATIONS.**

There were no deputations on this occasion.

**274. CHAIRMAN'S ANNOUNCEMENTS.**

The Chairman reported on the wide range of duties undertaken to represent and promote the County Council and its strong community leadership role. In particular the Chairman reported on the newly appointed Deputy Lieutenants for Hampshire; recognition of the Armed Forces on Reserves Day on 8 September; visit of HRH Countess of Wessex to the New Forest Show on 27 July; afternoon tea with the Lord Mayor of London to mark the 350<sup>th</sup> anniversary of the Great Fire of London on 2 September and the 40 Year Long Service Presentation on 12 September 2016.

The Chairman had pleasure in reporting on the successful Channel swim completed by Kate Fryatt, Project Manager and Armed Forces Lead Officer, on 6 September in 13 hours and 5 minutes. Members congratulated Kate on her achievement.

The Chairman's full report is attached to these Minutes as Appendix 1.

**275. LEADER'S REPORT.**

The Leader reported on a number of matters, including letters received from HM The Queen in response to a letter of congratulations from the County Council on her 90<sup>th</sup> birthday and also letters from the former Prime Minister, David Cameron MP, the new Prime Minister, Teresa May and the new Secretary of State for Communities and Local Government, Sajid Javid. The Leader had also written to all Hampshire Olympians and Para Olympians congratulating them on their achievements at Rio 2016.

The Leader had pleasure in reporting on a number of awards received by the County Council:

- the County Council's five Country Parks – Lepe, Queen Elizabeth, Royal Victoria, Manor Farm and Staunton had all been awarded Green Flags in recognition of their high standards
- Sir Harold Hillier Gardens had won three Gold Awards in three months including the South East in Bloom Award
- Moira Smyth from Children's Services and Chair of the County Council's Lesbian, Gay, Bisexual and Trans plus (LGBT+) Network for being awarded the 2016 Positive Role Model for LGBT at the National Diversity Awards
- Gold Award from the Ministry of Defence in recognition of the County Council's work with the Armed Forces Covenant and the Civilian Military Partnership.

The Leader also reported on the success of the County Youth Orchestra on their tour of Hungary, which had earned praise from the Foreign and Commonwealth Office.

The Leader reported that the Serving Hampshire consultation had closed and responses would now be analysed. The Leader reiterated the County Council's position that asking the people of Hampshire for their views first before entering any Devolution deals was considered to be the right way forward. The Leader confirmed that he would continue to seek dialogue with Hampshire's District Councils, other partners, MPs and the Government to get a good deal for Hampshire to enable good services to be sustained.

In conclusion the Leader reported on provisional exam results of young people attending Hampshire schools and colleges, which had outpaced national results at GCSE and A level.

The Leader's full report is attached to these Minutes as Appendix 2.

**277. APPOINTMENTS.**

The Council considered a report from the Chief Executive and presented by the Leader (Item 8 in the Minute Book) seeking approval of a number of changes to the membership of the County Council's Committees and Panels. Some additional appointments were proposed by the Leader.

RESOLVED:

- a) That Mrs Amanda Cawood replace Mrs Lisa Gilmour as the Co-opted Member on the Standing Advisory Council for Religious Education representing the Church of Jesus Christ of the Latter Day Saints.
- b) That Mr Danny Sullivan replace Mrs Margaret Mitchell on the Standing Advisory Council for Religious Education as the Roman Catholic representative.
- c) That Councillor John Wall replace Councillor Frank Pearce on the Regulatory Committee.
- d) That Councillor Anna McNair Scott be appointed as the Conservative Substitute Member and Councillor Keith House as the Liberal Democrat Substitute Member on the Standing Advisory Council for Religious Education.

- e) That Ms. Sue Bowen replace Mrs Joyce Johnson who is retiring as one of Co-opted Members representing the Church of England on the Standing Advisory Council for Religious Education.

**278. LOCALISM ACT 2011: APPOINTMENT OF INDEPENDENT PERSONS.**

The Council considered a report from the Conduct Advisory Panel (Item 9 in the Minute Book) recommending the appointment of Independent Persons in accordance with the requirements of the Localism Act 2011. For clarity, it was confirmed that these appointments are for Independent Persons and not Independent Members of the County Council.

RESOLVED:

That the appointment of Mr Michael Cronin and Mr Peter Moore as Independent Persons for a four-year period of office expiring in September 2020 be approved.

**279. CAPITAL FUNDING APPROVAL.**

Councillor Seán Woodward declared a personal interest as Leader of Fareham Borough Council and Director of the Solent Local Enterprise Partnership.

The Council considered a report from the Cabinet (Item 10 in the Minute Book) seeking approval for a funding contribution of £8.5m for the Stubbington Bypass. In presenting the report, the Executive Member for Economic Development reported that the Scheme was subject to some contingencies – a successful outcome to the Local Growth Fund bid submitted by the Solent Local Enterprise Partnership (LEP) which would be up against other bids across the country and formal agreement being secured from the Solent LEP to fund all of the County Council's borrowing costs through the ring-fenced business rates received from the Solent Enterprise Zone. The Executive Member reported that the Chancellor of the Exchequer's Autumn Statement was awaited to find out if the Scheme has been approved.

During the course of debate, Members expressed thanks to Stuart Jarvis, Director of Economy, Transport and Environment and officers in his department for their expertise and the work they had done on this project, which was an excellent investment in the infrastructure for the Fareham and Gosport areas to greatly improve access for residents and visitors.

RESOLVED:

That a funding contribution to the Stubbington Bypass scheme, in the sum of £8.5m, to be funded from borrowing, be approved subject to:

- a) a successful Local Growth Fund bid being agreed to secure the additional funding required to deliver the scheme.
- b) formal agreement being secured from the Solent LEP to fund all the Council's borrowing costs through the ring-fenced business rates received from the Solent Enterprise Zone.

**280. NOTICE OF MOTION.**

The Council considered a Notice of Motion submitted in accordance with Standing Order 18.1 proposed by Councillor Roy Perry and seconded by Councillor Keith Mans:

“That Hampshire County Council congratulates all of Hampshire’s Olympic and Paralympic athletes on their achievements in Rio and for the encouragement this will give to the next generation of aspiring Olympians and Paralympians from Hampshire.”

During the course of discussion Members recognised the excellent support provided to all athletes by their families and friends and the role played by, for example, schools, colleges and the Armed Forces for the facilities provided to help develop aspiring sports people. The Leader indicated that he was hoping to host a reception for all of Hampshire’s Olympic and Paralympic athletes in recognition of their achievements.

In putting the Motion to the vote, Members requested that words be added to make specific reference to ex-servicemen and women, many of whom overcome significant challenges to achieve their goals. Their was unanimous support and it was accordingly

**Appendix 2****LEADER'S REPORT**

I welcome members back from their Summer holidays.

A great summer especially with the British success at the Olympics and Para Olympics. We have a Motion later on the Agenda when I will say some more about Hampshire successes.

I can report that I have received replies to my letters from HM The Queen thanking us for her congratulations on her 90<sup>th</sup> Birthday and also from David Cameron, Teresa May and Sajid Javid.

Sajid Javid has yet to make any clear statement on his position re: Devolution which I await with interest although I did note in a speech reported in the LGC he declared that as Local Government is responsible for £1 in every £4 of public expenditure there are bound to be further savings that are possible. This spells out clearly that the financial regime established by the Coalition Government that the days of austerity will continue and indeed at the County Cabinet this week we addressed the further £40million to be saved by the end of 2017 and the anticipated additional £140million to be saved by 2020. Since 2008 this will amount to some £480million. It is indeed relentless and I am warning ministers it cannot continue without serious damage to the essential statutory services.

The Serving Hampshire Consultation has just concluded and will now need to be analysed. I have been clear throughout the consultation that we would not follow the Solent Cities and IOW process of seeking to strike a deal with Government and then asking people what they think of the deal but rather seek feelings on key issues first like - do Hampshire residents want a system with an elected Mayor? Do we want a combined authority and if so which area to be covered? For instance should it include the cities or not? What do people think of a Unitary structure or how about the status quo? The Conservative in me hankers for the status quo but is that sustainable.

I know District councils are unhappy at some of the questions but they are questions that need to be asked and addressed. For my part I shall seek to continue the dialogue with District Councils and other partners and MPs and Government to get a good deal for Hampshire enabling us to sustain good services across Hampshire. To that end we have a meeting of HLOWLGA tomorrow at Lyndhurst.

And despite Brexit, disarray on devolution and the continuing cuts in Government funding I can report good news, success and achievements.

I have written to all Hampshire Olympians and Para Olympians congratulating them and I hope it may be possible to arrange a reception for them in the Great Hall. According to figures given to me there were 16 in total and two Gold

Medallists in Hockey and Golf: Alex Danson and Justin Rose both from Hart. Our 5 Country Parks: Lepe, Queen Elizabeth, Royal Victoria, Manor Farm and Staunton have all been awarded Green Flags for their high standards. Councillor Gibson has great plans to help their financial success as well as their environmental success - The Sir Harold Hillier Gardens has won three gold awards in three months, particularly winning the South East in Bloom Awards.

I especially congratulate Moira Smyth from Children's Services and Chair of the Hampshire County Council Lesbian Gay Bisexual Trans plus (LGBT+) network who has won the 2016 Positive Role Model for LGBT. Well done Moira.

Of particular note Hampshire County Council was awarded the Ministry of Defence Employers Gold Award in recognition of our work with the Armed Forces Covenant and our Civilian Military Partnership. Of particular note is the Poppy Pods at Tile Barn, Brockenhurst opened by HRH The Duchess of Cornwall where we offer military families free weekend access to the camping pods.

Our Youth Orchestra had an amazing tour of Hungary even earning particular praise from the Foreign and Commonwealth Office.

I can also report from provisional results that yet again youngsters from Hampshire Schools have outpaced national results at GCSE. These are provisional results but as the debate on the Education Green Paper now opens it is worth noting.

In 2016 according to the provisional results 63% of Hampshire's school pupils achieved 5 good GCSE's compared to 60% last year when England average was 54%. And since it is reported that nationally there was a slight decline this year whereas in Hampshire we saw a rise, it would seem Hampshire schools have again well exceeded the national average.

At A level 18% of Hampshire Pupils with 3 good A Levels (A and B Grades) was 18% compared to Kent on 16.5% and the English State school average of 15.9%.

Now is not the time for the debate on Grammar Schools but my congratulations to Hampshire pupils and our secondary schools and 6<sup>th</sup> Form Colleges.

“There is a genuine concern that Hampshire CCGs are increasingly unable to guarantee the NHS recommended standards with regard to GP/patient number ratios. By what means does the Executive Member believe this County Council can positively influence and help manage such a serious situation?”

- 2. From Councillor David Simpson to the Leader:**

“How many people have been declared vexatious complainants in the last four calendar years? Will you please break this down by department and/or director and per year.”

- 3. From Councillor Chris Wood to the Executive Member for Culture, Recreation & Countryside:**

"Will the Executive Member, please confirm that Hampshire County Council will continue to fund the Hampshire Talented Athlete Scheme at the same level that it has done for the last four years, for the next four years?"

- 4. From Councillor Mark Staplehurst to the Executive Member for Environment & Transport:**

“Given the expression of concern raised by many residents over the introduction of excessive fees at, and vastly reduced opening hours of, our Hampshire Waste and Recycling Centres, what action does the County propose to take in the event of a potentially and likely increase in fly-tipping?”

- 5. From Councillor Jackie Porter to the Executive Lead Member for Children’s Services:**

“What efforts did HCC have to make regarding the collapse of 4Children?”

- 6. From Councillor Martin Lyon to the Executive Member for Environment & Transport:**

“Noting the significant number of dwellings planned to be built, or being

built, in Hampshire over the next 10-15 years, is the Executive Member in a position to provide this council with a coherent county highways and public services strategic infrastructure plan for members to review and comment upon prior to the next full council meeting?"
