1. Approves the 0-19 Children's Services grant, applications of £5,000 and over for 2017/18 totalling £798,077 for organisations within Hampshire.
2. Notes the 0-19 Children's Services grant applications of £5,000 or under for 2017/18 totalling £46,171.22 awarded through delegated powers.
3. Approves the 0-19 Children's Services grant allocation to Hampshire Young Carers of £164,205.
4. Approves delegated authority to the Director of Children's Services to award grants to a total value of £91,754 to meet targeted local needs.
