- Links and relationships with other strategic forums and partnerships e.g. District HWB Forum, Hampshire safeguarding boards, community safety partnerships, etc.
- Maps other plans and strategies supporting HWB objectives e.g. Public Health, Supportive Communities Programme, Ageing Well, Troubled families Programme, Sustainability Transformation Plans, etc.
- Arrangements to review the progress of the HWB and to gain information to inform a new strategy 2018 onwards.
