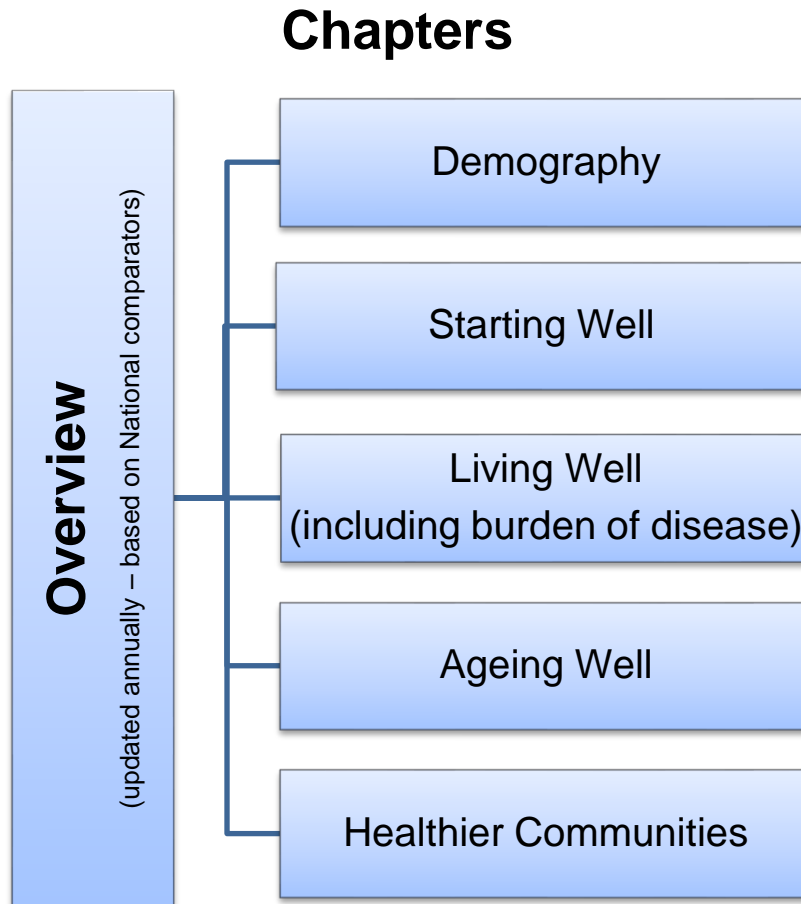
JSNA - the process

The JSNA looks at the current and future health and social care needs and wider social factors

- Uses
 - Aggregate data to understand where needs are not being met
 - A range of data sources eg
 - Census
 - Service
 - Mortality
 - Illness

To inform planning, commissioning of health, wellbeing and care services.

Proposed structure for the JSNA for 2017-2022



- The vision is to have a strong web based presence with digestible summaries for each chapter.
- We will be working very closely with our council colleagues and partners to produce each chapter
- Five year rolling programme (2017-2022) to align with new data being published from the Census.
- Regular updates for each chapter as detailed needs assessments/reports are produced and will be made available as links through each chapter.

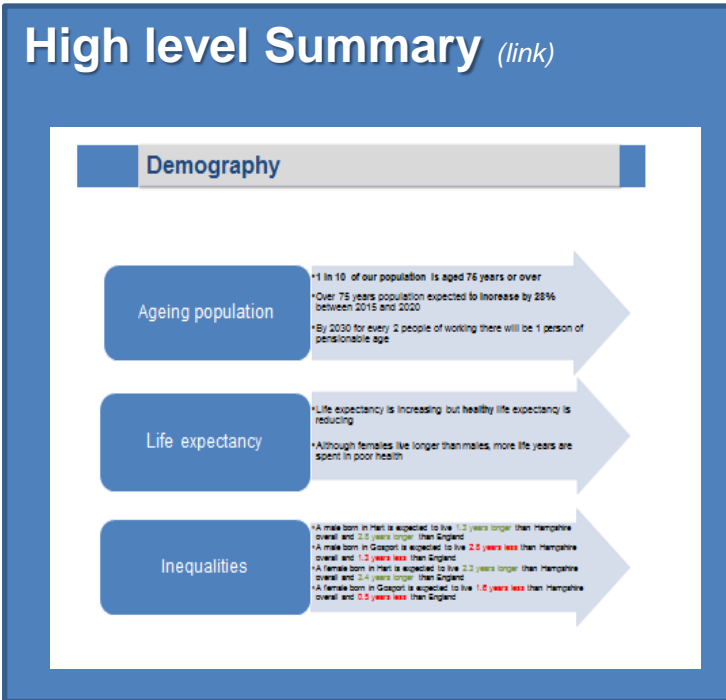
