### **1. Executive Summary**

1.1. The purpose of this paper is to seek approval for funding of £450 to Purbrook and Widley Residents Association (PAWRA) for local environmental improvements (bulb planting and work to a community pond) via the East Central Hampshire Action Team (HAT) Community Budget 2010/11.

### **2. Contextual information**

2.1. PAWRA are a very active community group who work closely with the local Horticultural Society to improve the local environment.

2.2. The proposal is fully outlined in the bid form attached as Appendix C.

### **3. Finance**

3.1. The total funding allocation for the East Central HAT is £200,000. The amount currently remaining is £114,980.

3.2. The amount of funding requested is £450 which is the total project cost.

3.3. Checks have been made which confirm this is a bona fide organisation.

### **4. Legal Implications**

4.1. The County Council has the power under S137 (3) of the Local Government Act 1972 to incur expenditure on contributions to any of the following funds,  
 (a) the funds of any charitable body in furtherance of its work in the United Kingdom;

(b) the funds of any body which provides any public service (whether to the public at large or to any section of it) in the United Kingdom otherwise than for the purposes of gain;

4.2. PAWRA falls under section b).

## **5. Monitoring**

5.1. The intended outcomes of the project are outlined in the application form accompanying this report.

5.2. A detailed monitoring report setting out the final outcomes of the project will be sent out for completion at the end of the project.

## **6. Other key issues**

6.1. There are no other key issues associated with this request.

## **7. Statements of Support**

7.1. This application has majority support of the East Central HAT.

7.2. The Executive Member for Environment, Councillor Kendal, supports this application because of the environmental improvements implicit therein.

7.3. Senior officers from the County Council's Culture, Communities and Rural Affairs department have been consulted and are supportive. This is a good Big Society project. Evaluation and publicity should help to spread the word on this and other low cost solutions to environment improvement.

7.4. Senior officers from the County Council's Environment department have been consulted and are supportive. This is a welcome local initiative to restore a valued local feature and to improve the setting of the highway. Early liaison with the Highway Authority is required to take forward planting on the verge to ensure that this is undertaken safely and maintenance operations can respond appropriately. These comments will be fed back to PAWRA.

## **8. Recommendation**

8.1. That the Executive Member for Communities and International Relations approves a sum of £450 to Purbrook and Widley Residents Association (PAWRA) for local environmental improvements from the East Central Hampshire Action Team Community Budget 2010/11 only, with no expectation of funding for future years.
