The church is providing local staffing to equate to £100k over 3 years. The lease on Threshers is for 6 years with a break clause after 3.

Details of the Bid / Project

Title of Bid/ Project	<i>The Gateway One Stop Community Shop (working title)</i>
Summary of Bid/ Project	<p>The application is part of a three way partnership between Hampshire County Council, Fareham Borough Council and church. This application is to part fund the running costs (for three years as part of a six year lease) incurred wholly and exclusively in providing a community 'one stop' shop which will include a café, computers with internet access and meeting rooms for use by various service providers. This will provide a much needed community focus to the most deprived area in Fareham Borough and bring help to residents in a more accessible manner.</p> <p>This project is supported by the Network Fareham Local Strategic Partnership. How does the Bid meet the HATs Term of Reference? 1) To tackle economic, social and health inequalities in the local area 2) To support the delivery of Hampshire's improvement priorities within the Hampshire Local Area Agreement* 3) To support local highways and transport priorities**	<p>a. This project works closely with Hampshire Police who support this initiative and it will form part of their community policing, being a safe place for information to be shared and the police will be holding regular surgeries on the site. It will have the potential to be used by groups 'at risk' of offending, which is something we will be considering in more detail in 2011.</p> <p>b. We hope the cafe will combat social exclusion, by providing a safe and enjoyable place for residents to come and have a chat, with users or with our volunteers, many of whom have listening skills training. It will also provide access to computers and the internet to those who do not have access at home and cannot travel into the town centre. In addition, the suite of counselling rooms is specifically to help those in trouble receive the help and support that they need e.g. in handling debt and relationship difficulties.</p> <p>c. The Fareham Park area is known as being a 'tight' self-contained community within Fareham but the only hub currently is that provided commercially by the Highlands Road shopping precinct. The aim of the shop is to provide a social hub that works where people already gather for shopping and to access GPs, etc and complements what is already going on. It will show a real and imaginative investment in the people of the area and foster a sense of love and care.</p>
Timescale (What is the anticipated period over which the money will be spent?)	<p>Commencement Date: October 2010</p> <p>Completion Date: February 2014</p>
Intended Outcomes (How will the success of the bid/project be measured?)	<p>Well being and deprivation is notoriously hard to assess, particularly as any data collected and presented in geographic areas that straddle Fareham Park and the timescales are very short. However, the level of usage by partner organisations, and their feedback and data collected will give us a good idea if the problems are addressed sufficiently.</p>

Future Funding Arrangements (If the project is to last more than a year how will it be funded in subsequent years? How will any outcomes achieved by the project be sustained in the longer term? If it is a capital scheme how will the equipment be maintained?)	Funding arrangements, providing this bid is successful have been secured for the next 3 years.
