Actions from Previous Local Highways Meeting
3rd December 2009**

Problems with Eastleigh Bus Station:- These issues have been included in the Town Access Plan's implementation list.

Romsey Road Lidl Roundabout Railings:- Safety audit carried out. As a result a section of the railings at the end of Upper Market Street will be removed and the remainder tidied up, early in the new financial year. This will allow people crossing by The Railway Institute to access the south footway, without having to walk around the end of the barrier. The railings at the Twyford Road junction must remain for now, but the need for a crossing point here is being considered as part of the Town Access Plan.

M27 junction 5 improvements and lay-by removals:- the lay-by will be removed as part of the works in phase 2 as segregated left turn land from Wide Lane into the west bound on slip starts well back from the junction and will replace the existing lay-by. Due to the alignment of Wide Lane and available space it is not possible to provide another lay-by on the southern approach to the roundabout.

Regular flooding of Leigh Road:- Southern Water have been contacted.

1/09	Twyford Road, Eastleigh – request for pedestrian crossing facilities in the vicinity of 'Seeability', just north of St John's Road.	Cllr Thomas	Mary-Ann Toop, Area Transport Manager, Traffic and Transport Team South	Location does not meet the criteria for a formal pedestrian crossing although it is accepted that there are special circumstances in this location. Therefore further investigations into the possibility of the implementation of an informal crossing point to assist/highlight pedestrians crossing in this location will be undertaken. <i>Investigations</i> Further consultation with 'Seeability' have taken place and they have indicated that an informal crossing would not be suitable for their use. A study will be undertaken to investigate possible improvements along this section of Twyford Road to improve access for pedestrians and cyclists. The issues raised by 'Seeability' will be included within this study.	(H)
