**Matters Arising
Actions from Previous Local Highways Meeting
30th March 2010**

Highways officers to investigate vegetation clearance around Junction 5 of the M27 due to Cllr Kyrle's concerns of disturbance of bird nesting – This has been resolved and Member has been contacted.

Heath House Lane, Hedge End - Investigations have been unable to identify who raised the original 30mph limit request. It has not therefore been possible to clarify any outstanding concerns regarding the current speed limit since Eastleigh Borough Council installed the gateway feature. No further complaints have been received.

Chris Lait to feed all points raised by members into the County review of winter maintenance – This has been done.

Councillor Kyrle to be kept updated re progress on Lower Northam Road and Botley Cycles schemes - Cllr Kyrle has been briefed both individually and as part of HEWEB.

Pedestrian safety when accessing the recreational facilities and the Hub sports complex, Bishopstoke.- The crossing needs are incorporated within the feasibility study being carried out along Bishopstoke Road.

Alan Drayton Way – request for 30mph speed limit - This will be picked up within the Hampshire wide A & B speed limit review.

Barrier damage around pedestrian crossing Alan Drayton Way and concerns regarding fencing around adjacent play area - Barrier repairs for Alan Drayton Way have been completed, subject to inspection of any further damage. In addition, it is suggested that a length of fence adjacent to the play area would prevent children running up and over the bank into the road. This option has been added to the Minor Works Programme list for consideration of Members.

Riverside barriers are damaged and partly in the river following a road traffic accident – The railings were recovered and it is anticipated that the replacement works will commence in September. A spare post and mould is now held in stock to speed any future replacement of the bespoke railings.
