Initial monitoring has revealed some parking on the grass verges. Residents suggest that this has increased since the waiting restrictions have been implemented on Cherque Way – initial observations did not substantiate this, but further parking surveys were agreed.</p> <p>11 parking surveys undertaken at various times and days in April &amp; May revealed no significant parking issues or hazards. Police confirmed they are not aware of any issues as significant as residents suggest. The main enquirer replied 4.7.10 that he is very unhappy with this response and that HCC has not taken residents views into account.</p> <p>Further response was sent 15.07.10 reiterating that highway monies will not be prioritised for additional parking facilities and that consideration will be given through HAT for TRO's to address the traffic concerns, i.e. parking close to traffic island allegedly causing some traffic to pass by on the wrong side of the island. Planning issues referred back to GBC and Police asked to continue monitoring.</p> <p>TRO's are not felt appropriate at present and may only exacerbate problems by further reducing on-road parking space. However, the situation will continue to be monitored and waiting restrictions, if necessary, will be considered through the TRO prioritisation process in the usual way.</p>
