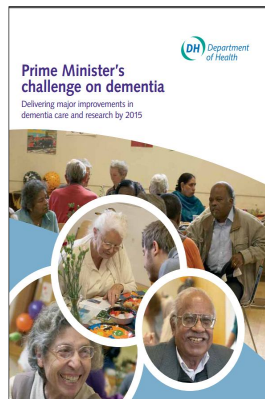

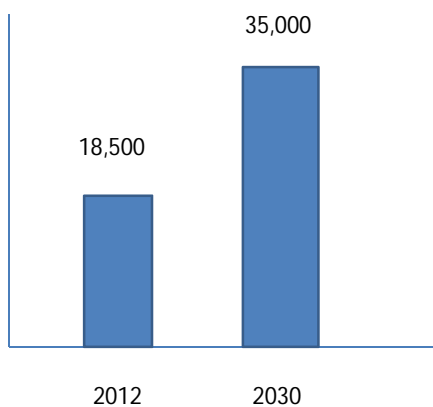


Prime Minister's challenge on dementia

- An engaged community enthusiastic about and supportive of people with dementia that promotes inclusivity in it's everyday services such as shops, leisure centres, opticians, hairdressers, restaurants, etc

- Demonstrator site, Andover
- County wide 1st October 2012
- 1451 people being supported across Hants at end Yr 1
- Great feedback from Service Users re support received

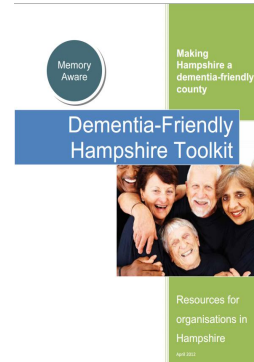
Dementia Advisor Services

- Anyone with a diagnosis of dementia
- Anyone with possible dementia, offering support through the diagnostic process
- Focus on well-being
- Supports people to come to terms with and live well with dementia
- Tailored information
- Offers advice, signposting and support to access
- Point of continuity

Dementia Friendly Community

A dementia friendly community is one in which it is possible for the greatest number of people to live a good life with dementia; where people with dementia are enabled to live as independently as possible and to continue to be part of their community, but at the same time are met with understanding and given support where necessary.

Progress in year one



- Hampshire Dementia Action Alliance launched on 3rd Sept, 112 members
- 3 Dementia Friendly High Streets launched in Fareham, Lyndhurst and Fleet
- 11 Dementia Ambassadors confirmed
- 130 dementia awareness sessions held covering 1305 people
- Many other presentations and 'Spotlight on Dementia' events
- Peer support mapped across county
- 9 new support groups launched
- End of Year report
