### 1. The decision:

1.1. That a traffic order be implemented under the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984, the effects of which will be will be to implement a with-flow cycle lane and no waiting at any time in Lynton Road as follows:

- (i) To prohibit all vehicles, except pedal cycles on its east side between its junction with Woolmer Way and a point 27 metres north thereof with an overall width of 1 metre, all days, southbound, with-flow.
- (ii) No waiting at any time, east side between its junction with Woolmer Way and a point 33 metres north thereof.

### 2. Reason(s) for the decision:

- 2.1. No objections or representations were received in response to the public consultation which took place between 26 February and 18 March 2016.
- 2.2. The order is proposed to implement a short section of mandatory cycle lane and associated double-yellow lines on the east side of Lynton Road to link a proposed advisory cycle route in Devon Road with an existing advisory lane in the exit road from the nearby Tesco store.

The proposal will also prevent on-street parking along the length concerned so that cyclists can use the section of cycle lane safely. The proposal is part of a series of measures throughout Whitehill and Bordon to improve facilities and encourage more cycling.
