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1. The decision:

- 1.1. That authority be given to the Chief Executive's Department in accordance with Paragraph 1.23 of the Economy, Transport and Environment Department's Scheme of Delegation to enter into an agreement under Section 278 of the Highways Act 1980 with Bellway Homes Limited of Seaton Burn House, Dudley Lane, Seaton Burn, Newcastle Upon Tyne, NE13 6BE; TAYLOR WIMPEY UK LIMITED of Gate House, Turnpike Road, High Wycombe, Buckinghamshire, HP12 3NR and BOVIS HOMES LIMITED of The Manor House, North Ash Road, New Ash Green, Longfield, Kent, DA3 8HQ relating to Land at Land at Woodley Lane, Bus Access, Abbottswood.

2. Reason(s) for the decision:

- 2.1. Planning consent for development of the Land at Abbottswood, Romsey was obtained from Test Valley Borough Council under reference 08/00475OUTS.
- 2.2. In order to provide suitable bus access to the development, a new bus access is required. The developer has submitted and gained approval to a design for the works consisting of;
 - Construction of new 'all moves' bellmouth bus only access/egress onto Woodley Lane, bus stops, footway construction and signage.
- 2.3. The completion of the Section 278 Agreement enables the developer to undertake the highway works, in accordance with the terms and conditions that the County Council has stipulated. The works are considered to provide public benefit.
- 2.4. The Agreement also provides for the dedication as public highway of the land necessary for the works, and the County Council has agreed that following completion of the works and a one-year maintenance period to thereafter maintain the works as public highway.

2.5. The full cost of the works, including any costs to the County Council in facilitating the works, will be met by the developer under the terms of the Agreement.

3. Other options considered and rejected:

Not to agree to enter into the agreement

3.1. This option was considered but dismissed on the basis that the applicant has demonstrated that the proposed works can be constructed in a safe manner and to an acceptable standard, that planning consent for the development including access exists, and that the works will provide essential access to the development site.

To agree a different specification of works

3.2. This was considered but dismissed. The access works as secured in the Agreement are considered to be satisfactory and appropriate to provide access to the development without unacceptably impacting on the safety of the public highway.
