1. The decision:

1.1. That a Traffic Order be implemented under the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984, the effect of which will be to impose a 30 miles per hour speed limit on the following lengths of road at Poulner:

- (i) U120 Linford Road between a point 115 metres north-east of its junction with U120 Hangersley Hill and its junction with U120 Butlers Lane, an approximate distance of 360 metres.
- (ii) U120 Hangersley Hill between its junction with U120 Linford Road and a point 130 metres east thereof.

1.2 The order will also revoke and re-enact the provisions contained in the following existing orders

- (i) The Hampshire County Council (Various Roads, Poulner) (30 Miles per Hour Speed Limit) Order 1971
- (ii) The Hampshire (Various Roads, New Forest South) (40 Miles per Hour Speed Limit) Order 1992 *insofar as it relates to north-east Ringwood (items (5) to (9)).*

with no change of substance save for the addition of the restrictions described above, however as a result of the way these matters are described, descriptions may differ.

2. Reasons for the decision:

2.1. This proposal is in response to requests from the local County Councillor following inclusion of a children's play group to the existing Church Hall activities.

The proposal, which will have the effect of enhancing the safety of residents, and in particular those accessing the Church Hall, has the support of Ringwood Town Council and the Police have no objections.
