What is Prevent?

Aim: to stop people becoming terrorists or supporting terrorism

All forms of extremism


Safeguarding

Partnership

Prevent Strategy

Current UK Terrorism Threat Level

An attack is:

A large red arrow points from the left edge of the slide towards the 'Severe' row of the table.

Critical	Imminent
Severe	Highly likely
Substantial	Strong possibility
Moderate	Possible, not likely
Low	Unlikely



The Threats

1. ISIS
2. Al Qaida
3. Irish Republican terrorism
4. Domestic Extremism / Extreme Right Wing
5. Animal Rights & eco-terrorism



What is Channel?

National programme to safeguarding children & adults from being drawn into terrorism.
Became statutory - February 2015.

Early intervention to protect and divert people away from the risk they face before illegal activity occurs.



Referrals

- Received by any safeguarding professional
- MASH
- Police coordinate

Counter Terrorism & Security Act 2015



Places a duty upon local authorities and other specified authorities* to have

‘due regard to the need to prevent people from being drawn into terrorism.’

* Local authorities, Police, Prisons, Probation, Schools, Colleges, Universities, NHS bodies.



Counter-Terrorism
and Security Act 2015

Specified agencies must:



- Assess risk
- Develop action plans
- Train staff to recognise radicalisation
- Establish referral mechanisms to Channel
- Maintain records & show compliance
- Coordinate Prevent using multi-agency groups.
- Establish responsible booking policy for public venues.
