## **1. Summary**

- 1.1. This report summarises the incidents and events in the Harbour from 27 March 2010 to 18 May 2010. For information, the report also includes (as Appendix 1) a list of incidents during the period 6 - 26 March (ie covering the full period since the last Management Committee meeting). Any incidents or events which take place after this report is distributed will be subject of a separate Annex to be distributed at the meeting.

## **2. Patrols**

- 2.1. The summer roster started on 4 May 2010 with four new temporary staff for the summer season. The Harbour has been patrolled by the duty Harbour Master at various times between the hours of 0700 to 2200

## **3. Incidents and events**

- 3.1. 27 March. Patrol assisted a small RIB to Mercury Yacht Harbour following engine failure.
- 3.2. 2 April. Patrol called to a vessel on a mooring site where the stern sinker chain had corroded at the shackle which joins to the ground chain. Vessel and tackle recovered and owner informed.
- 3.3. 4 April. Patrol called to mid-stream mooring to replace mooring lines that had frayed badly. Owner informed.
- 3.4. 5 April. Call received from Coastguard reporting yacht aground on Hook Spit. Hamble Rescue and Calshot Lifeboat in attendance. The yacht was eventually recovered about five hours later and lifted out at Hamble Point Marina.

- 3.5. 5 April. Patrol assisted small cruiser back to mooring due to engine failure.
- 3.6. 23 April. Tender and outboard engine reported stolen from Hamble Jetty. Marine Police informed.
- 3.7. 25 April. Small outboard engine stolen from a vessel moored on a mid-stream mooring. Marine Police informed.
- 3.8. 25 April. Patrol called to remove a vessel berthed on the wrong mooring, preventing access by the mooring holder. Vessel towed to Visitors Pontoon, owner informed and invoiced.
- 3.9. 25 April. Patrol called to a vessel tangled up in mooring lines while returning to the Royal Southern Yacht Club. Hamble – Warsash Ferry helped free the vessel and repaired the mooring.
- 3.10. 25 April. Call received from a mooring holder with fouled prop while trying to come alongside his mooring. At the same time his wife had fallen into the water. The wife was recovered and checked for injuries and the vessel was moored on a temporary berth for the night.
- 3.11. 27 April. Coastguard asked for assistance with a vessel that had been holed and taking on water in the Calshot area. Patrol responded to the request and assisted Calshot Lifeboat (already in attendance) to pump out. Patrol escorted the lifeboat and stricken vessel back to the harbour and the vessel was lifted out at Hamble Point Marina.
- 3.12. 28 April. Patrol responded to a call that an XOD had broken a stern line. On inspection the stern cleat had pulled out of the deck. Vessel was re – secured and the owner informed.
- 3.13. 3 May. Patrol noticed that two moorings had become tangled causing the two vessels to come together. The vessels were removed from the moorings, the mooring checked and the vessels placed back on the moorings. Both owners were informed.
- 3.14. 10 May. Call received from a distressed yachtsman with engine failure just outside the harbour. Patrol responded to the call and towed the vessel back to his mooring.
- 3.15. 15 May. Patrol received a call from a vessel that had gone aground on the Hamble Spit and required assistance. Patrol towed the vessel off the Spit. No damage was sustained by the vessel.
- 3.16. 17 May. Call received asking for assistance with a vessel aground on Hook Spit. Patrol attended and towed the vessel to safety.

#### **4. Safety Management System**

- 4.1. Progress has been made on reviewing and updating the current Safety Management System. Consultation has been completed and a revised Code of Practice for races, events and regattas on the River Hamble has been implemented. It is working well and has widespread support amongst the various organisations involved. A meeting has been organised with the

appropriate organisations at the end of the year to review the efficiency of the new Code.

## **5. Training**

- 5.1. Staff have undertaken two training sessions since March. All staff completed a refresher VHF/DSC course in April and a bespoke manual handling course was undertaken in May. The main aim of the day was to refresh all staff on the basic principles of manual handling but also to test techniques and equipment involved in the recovery of persons and large objects from the water.
- 5.2. A meeting between staff and representatives from the local police including Hamble, Warsash and the Marine Unit took place on 10 May. The aim of the meeting was to discuss local issues regarding youths, thefts and up coming events such as Hamble Week. The meeting also allowed all parties to be introduced to each and help improve communication channels.

## **6. Trinity House Audit**

- 6.1. An audit by Trinity House was undertaken on 21 April to check all Aids to Navigation and check on quarterly reporting of navigation aid defects to ensure compliance with Trinity House requirements. Everything was found to be in good order and there were no matters arising which require further action.

## **7. Pile Replacement Programme**

- 7.1. Twenty four Crown Estate piles have been replaced within the harbour. The programme was successfully completed on 13 April with minimal disruption to mooring holders.

**1. The following incidents took place during the period 6 - 26 March 2010:**

- 1.1 7 March. Motor boat reported sunk at Hamble Point Marina. Patrol attended in case of oil spill and provided assistance to divers to recover vessel. A charge was made for this service.
- 1.2. 10 March. Patrol found yacht with open forehatch – owner informed.
- 1.3 10 March. Report of theft of 8hp outboard motor from moored boat. Marine Police Unit aware.
- 1.4 13/14 March. Hamble River Sailing Club held its annual 'Warming Pan' dinghy racing in the River, without significant incident.
