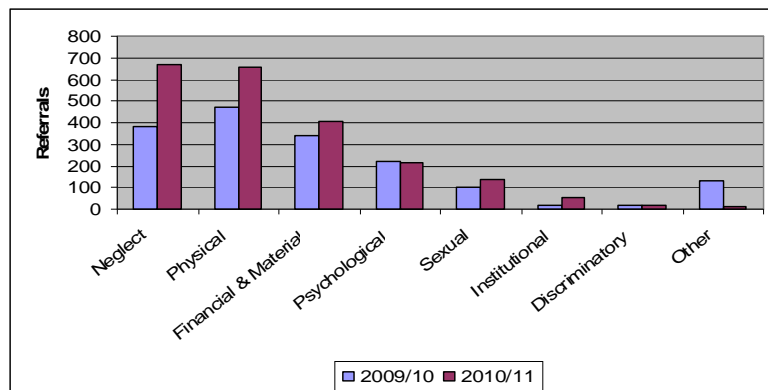
HSAB Accountability Statement 2010/11 Key Achievements

- Learning Disability Choking Review

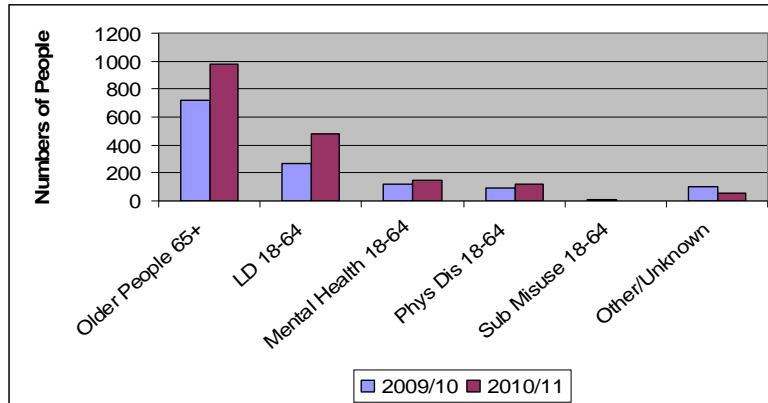
HSAB Accountability Statement 2010/11 Performance – Key Data

- 2029 referrals (1513 2009/10)
- 1795 people
- Learning Disability significant increase
- Institutional abuse
- Consistent with provisional national Abuse of Vulnerable Adult national data

HSAB Accountability Statement 2010/11 Outcomes

For the 1187 people with closed cases in 2010/11;

- 40.2% had increased monitoring
- 18.4% had no further action
- 17.4% had advice and information
- 24% had a range of other actions

- Police 240 charged offences (data unreliable)

HSAB Accountability Statement 2010/11 Priorities for 2011/12

- Review and strengthen the HSAB including consideration of Independent Chair
- Increase service user and carer involvement
- Lead revision of Pan-Hampshire Safeguarding Adults Policy
- Improve access to criminal justice for vulnerable adults (led by the Police and Crown Prosecution Service)
- Conclude Pan-Hampshire, multi-agency review of choking in LD clients
