Mental health rehabilitation review

The review – 6 month process

- Joint approach – health and social care
- Joint programme board
- Patient and service reviews undertaken

Outcomes

- Opportunities and improvements identified
 - Better connectivity
 - Improved quality
 - Support to move on as part of recovery
 - Increase community provision, reduce reliance on beds
 - Tailored services to personal needs



Mental health rehabilitation review

Views and feedback – service changes

- To develop a wider range of options for providing personal support to people in their own homes
- To support and to enable the personalisation of mental health rehabilitation services
- To further develop community rehabilitation services for this client group to be consistently good across the whole county



Mental health rehabilitation review

Eastrop House

- 8 beds in Basingstoke
- Temporarily closed since 2012
- Review confirmed beds no longer needed
- Releases Eastrop for other purposes

Engagement plan

- September – December engagement
- Direct with patients and carers
- RAISE providing expert support to ensure user-led approach



Mental health rehabilitation review

Next steps

- Sept – Dec 2015: Complete engagement with users, carers and families
- Oct 15 – Jan 16: Develop community model with staff
- Ongoing: Maintain effective joint working arrangements
- Feb 16: Develop business case for new models of care
- April 16: Begin implementation
