## Education & Participation

**Working across Hampshire to provide young people aged 16-18 (16-25 vulnerable groups) with 1:1 support to break down barriers, identify opportunities and support successful transition to Employment, Education or Training (EET).**

### Virtual College

- Specialist team - dedicated to working with priority groups including Care Leavers, to support their transition into education, training and employment
- Prioritising work with those aged 16-18, with extended support available for those up to age 24
- Statutory monitoring of post 16 career pathways for young people residing in Hampshire and those placed out of county.
- Intensive 1:1 engagement with the young people and their parents/carers
- Partnership work with key agencies to break down barriers and broker support

### Post 16 Monitoring & Engagement

- Annual monitoring of all Hampshire Young People in Years 12 and 13, with statutory returns to the Department of Education
- Signposting to relevant opportunities and continuing light touch support
- Regular monitoring of young people not in education, employment or training (NEET)
- Intensive 1:1 engagement, supporting young people to explore, secure and maintain post 16 pathways
- Work related support – exploring long term career goals, job searching, CV writing and interview guidance

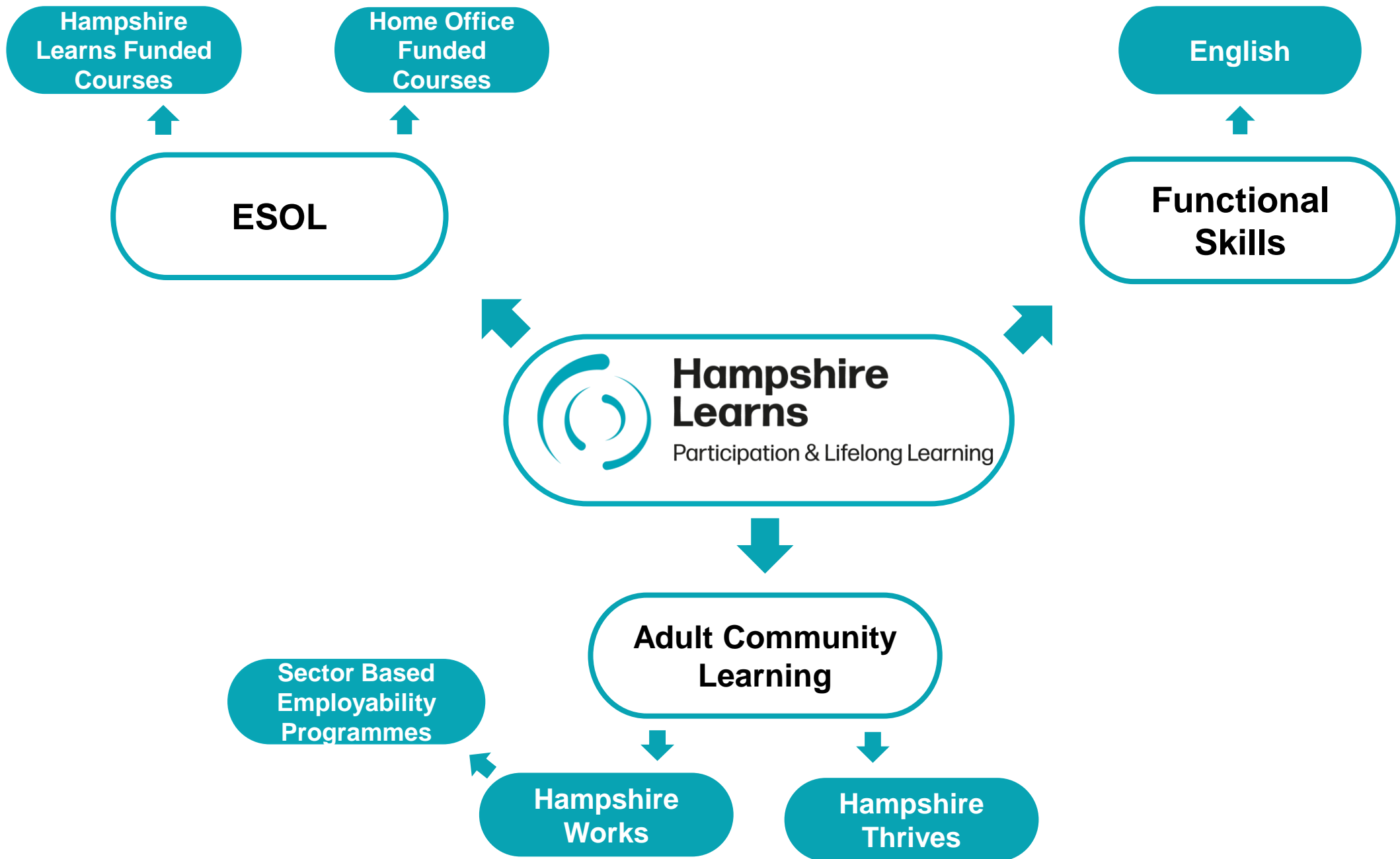

## Supported Internship Programme

# Young Peoples Learning

ESFA funded programme for anyone aged 16-24 with an EHCP  
Activity based 1 year programme - over 34 weeks

Starts in the Autumn Term through to the end of the Summer term

No requirement for English and Maths qualification – just a desire to be in work

### What is included?

- Functional Skills training is offered if required
- Classroom delivery is 2 days per week (face to face), working towards NCFE entry level qualification in Employability
- Social and Well Being sessions
- DofE award
- Careers advice and guidance
- Tutorials
- Opportunity to complete a minimum of 20 weeks of a Work Experience Placement
- Work Experience Placement supported by skills coaches (funded via Access to Work)
- Travel training is offered (and gradually reduced as confidence improves)

## Swanwick Lodge

## Secure & Specialist Education

## Leigh House

- Swanwick Lodge is a Secure Children's home
- For young people aged 10 – 17
- There is capacity for 10 young people
- Length of stay – 3 months plus (many in excess of 6 months)
- Placements are made from any Local Authority across the country
- Supporting young people placed under Section 25 of the Children's Act
- For young people identified as needing their liberty to be restricted

### What is offered?

- Education with a personalised timetable based on the young persons needs and their anticipated destination

- Leigh House is an acute adolescent inpatient unit with a particular expertise in treating eating disorders
- For young people aged 12 – 18
- There is capacity for 16 young people
- Average length of stay is in excess of 12 weeks
- Referrals are made from Hampshire and across the country
- Referrals are made with the agreement of the young person and their family
- Some young people are detained under the Mental Health Act

### What is offered?

- Education with a personalised timetable, with strong links with their home school and college to ensure a successful re integration

## Secure & Specialist Education

**Our Education Units operate within these secure and specialist hospital settings, providing a personalised education timetable, based on the young person's need**

### Austen House

- Low secure forensic hospital for young people with complex Mental Health needs
- For young people aged 12 – 18
- Capacity for 14 young people
- Stays are often in excess of one year
- Referrals received from all over the country
- For young people detained under the Mental Health Act as likely to pose a risk to themselves

### Bluebird House

- Medium secure forensic hospital for Young People with complex Mental Health needs
- For young people aged 12 – 18
- Capacity for 20 young people
- Stays are often in excess of one year
- Referrals received from all over the country
- For young people detained under the MH Act as likely to pose a risk to themselves or others
- Some YP detained under Ministry of Justice restrictions

## Outdoor Participation



**Working on a 1:1 basis and with small groups, on site or across multiple outdoor adventure sites. All staff come from an education background and with extensive training around working with young people with behavioural, SEND, mental health needs and multi-agency involvement.**

### Rewilding The Mind

An early intervention programme offering small group therapeutic nature-based provision for young people age 10+

ReWilding the Mind' focuses on nature connection and wellbeing using a blend of holistic and physical nature-based activities. Young people take part in a varied programme of outdoor activities; bushcraft, outdoor cooking, yoga and mindfulness, exploration, creative arts, interaction with animals, gardening, practical conservation, walking in nature and music.

Our 'ReWilding the Mind' well-being programmes aim to ensure that each young person who attends has defined outcomes and objectives, to support the positive impact on their well-being.

### Outdoor Achievements

A referred programme of 1-1 support to young people who have an Education Health Care Plan or are involved in multi agency support, and who are not in education, employment or training. Offering a programme to enhance future achievement, attainment and success.

The programme involves collecting young people from their home and supporting their attendance at a variety of personalised and bespoke outdoor learning programmes. Supporting them to gain achievements through nationally recognised youth awards such as DofE award and John Muir award, enhancing their education, engagement and participation skills.

Our staff provide termly reports and attend meetings with education and health care professionals to provide evidence of the individuals personal progress.

## Outdoor Participation

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SERVICE**

**Working on a 1:1 basis and with small groups, on site or across multiple outdoor adventure sites. All staff come from an education background and with extensive training around working with young people with behavioural, SEND, mental health needs and multi-agency involvement.**

### Outdoor Pathways

This small group work programme is offered to young people at our Minstead study centre - set amongst the beautiful woodlands of the New Forest.

This Outdoor provision is centred around bushcraft and outdoor learning models where young people can be creative in the outdoors though participating in bushcraft activities

Through these creative outdoor learning opportunities we enable young people, who are struggling with the standard curriculum and attainment at school, to express themselves and learn through structured activities in the outdoors.

Outdoor pathways leads to gaining a national AQA qualification (if the school is accredited)

### Outdoor Creatives

An on site programme delivered at residential and educational establishments.

Outdoor learning educators attend the school/setting to work alongside a small group of learners to create an outdoor learning environment/classroom.

Through offering hands on activity to create the outdoor classroom areas we support and encourage environmental awareness and understanding for the young people.

The creation of outdoor learning environments and the support to link this environment to the curriculum, results in an outdoor classroom which can be utilised and developed by the whole setting.



# Outdoor Participation

- Supporting the learners in Leigh House, Austen House, Bluebird House and Swanwick Lodge to access a program of outdoor education, including schemes such as The John Muir Award and the DofE award, alongside skills such as first aid, team building and leadership skills.

### School Residential & Day Visits

The Centre offers a wide range of outdoor activities designed to enhance and build upon classroom learning. Working mainly with pupils at KS1 and KS2, the Centre offers sessions that touch upon many curriculum areas – environmental science, geography, ancient history and art and craft in particular. Sustainable living is the golden thread throughout all of our courses, and we actively encourage the children to develop an interest in, connection to and love of the natural world. In addition, children undertaking visits to the Centre show increased confidence and independence, improved relationships with each other and with school staff - all whilst having a lot of fun!

As well as accommodation for 40 and great home cooked food, the Centre has a large classroom, an iron age style roundhouse and a range of habitats on site – ancient woodlands, stream, meadows, hedges and ponds. In addition, we have a large vegetable and fruit garden and three very friendly sheep! The location of the Centre means we make very good use of the surrounding national park.

### Self Catering Hire

The Centre is available to hire at weekends and during the school holidays as a self-catering group accommodation venue.
