### **About EMTAS**

Removing barriers and inequalities in engagement, progress and attainment is a priority for all schools. We work with school-based practitioners to develop practice and provision for children and young people from Black and Minority Ethnic (BME) and Traveller groups, including those learning English as an additional language (EAL).

All our work is underpinned by the United Nations Convention on the Rights of the Child (UNCRC) particularly Articles 22, 29 and 30, and is supported by continuous professional development and enhanced DBS (Disclosure and Barring) checks.

## EMTAS Summary Information

According to the Spring 2023 School Census, 3.7% of Hampshire's Black, Minority Ethnic and Traveller children were in Gosport schools (taken from the 'Ethnicity District' tab). This equates to 1157 children, compared with 1091 children, 3.8%, in 2022 - a slight rise in the number of children but a lower percentage. Additionally, 3.6% of Hampshire's EAL (English as an Additional Language) learners were in Gosport, which is equivalent to 568 children. This is a rise in the number of EAL learners since the previous two years, but the same percentage (3.6%).

In the academic year 2022-23 a total of 1117 children were referred to Hampshire's Ethnic Minority and Traveller Achievement Service, a high figure for the Service but not dissimilar to 2021-22. Of these 1117, 57 children were referred by schools in the Gosport district, 10 more than in 2021-22 and 41 more than in 2020-2021. The majority of these referrals were speakers of Malayalam or Sinhala.

Academic results for BME and Traveller groups are collected, analysed and reported on by Hampshire EMTAS annually. A summary analysis comparing the attainment and progress of BME and 'Hampshire All' is carried out in addition to more detailed analysis of attainment within individual groups. These data and analyses are made available by district in a separate progress and attainment data booklet. It also captures a range of other information such as attendance, the percentage of children eligible for Free School Meals (FSM) as well as the changing profile of the district in terms of languages and ethnic groups.

Within EMTAS, we recognise that different districts of Hampshire will have different needs according to their particular demographic.

All data that have been used are correct at the time of writing but may later be subject to minor changes as new data are published. Dates and sources are acknowledged. In some cases, numbers within ethnic groups are very small. To maintain confidentiality, values of 5 or less represented as <6.

Note that where numbers are small, although they may give an indication of a particular pattern it is very difficult to draw any firm conclusions and the data should therefore be used with caution.

**Language - Hampshire Summary - Pupils for whom English is an Additional Language (EAL)  
Summary by District and Academic Year**

Although the number of pupils learning EAL pupils in Gosport schools has increased, the percentage has stayed the same as in 2021 and 2022, at 3.6%, reflecting the rise in the total number of EAL learners across Hampshire. Gosport still has the lowest number and percentage of pupils with EAL in Hampshire, with 568 children, meaning that they and their families may be much more isolated than those living in districts where there are larger populations.

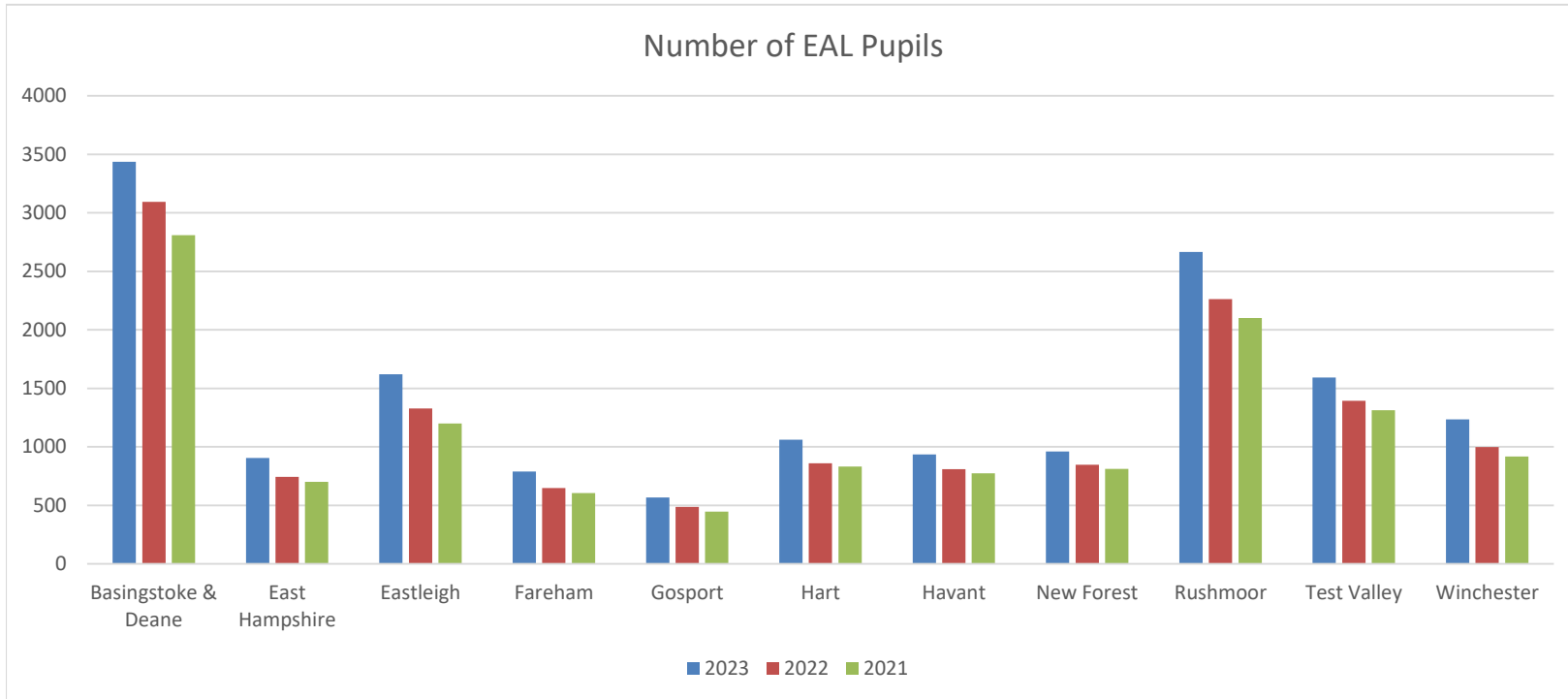

Overall, the census languages have been fairly consistent since 2021 with Polish and Malayalam being the top languages in Gosport over the last three years. There has been an increase in the number of speakers of Turkish, Chinese and Ukrainian since 2021. The increase in speakers of Chinese is largely due to the influx of children coming from Hong Kong via the Hong Kong British Nationals Overseas programme and the increase in Ukrainian and Russian speakers is because of the war in Ukraine. Note that languages recorded in the Census may differ from the languages spoken by children referred to as new arrivals to EMTAS.

Language data are collected termly; ethnicity data are collected in the Spring Term only. Accurate recording of pupils' home/first languages enables better targeting of additional resources. EMTAS have produced a leaflet giving further information about home/first language which is available on our website -

**Ethnicity - Gosport and Hampshire Summary - Pupils for whom English is an Additional Language (EAL)  
Summary by Ethnicity and Academic Year**

The largest ethnic minority group in the Gosport district is Any Other White Background (WOTH). This reflects the population of families originating from Poland and Ukraine as well as those from Turkish, Portuguese, Spanish, Bulgarian and Lithuanian backgrounds. The number of pupils from Any Other Mixed Background (MOTH) remains the second highest category. There is an increase in children from Black African, Black Caribbean and Indian backgrounds.

The percentage of BME, below, is different from that shown within the 'Ethnicity District' tab as this percentage is generated from all the Pupils in this district, not all of Hampshire

Gosport has the lowest number (1157) and percentage (3.7%) of pupils from BME backgrounds of all the districts of Hampshire, a trend that has been evident across all three years, shown in the table below. Despite a slight decrease in percentage, the number of BME pupils in Gosport has slowly increased since 2021 in line with the trend across most other districts of Hampshire.

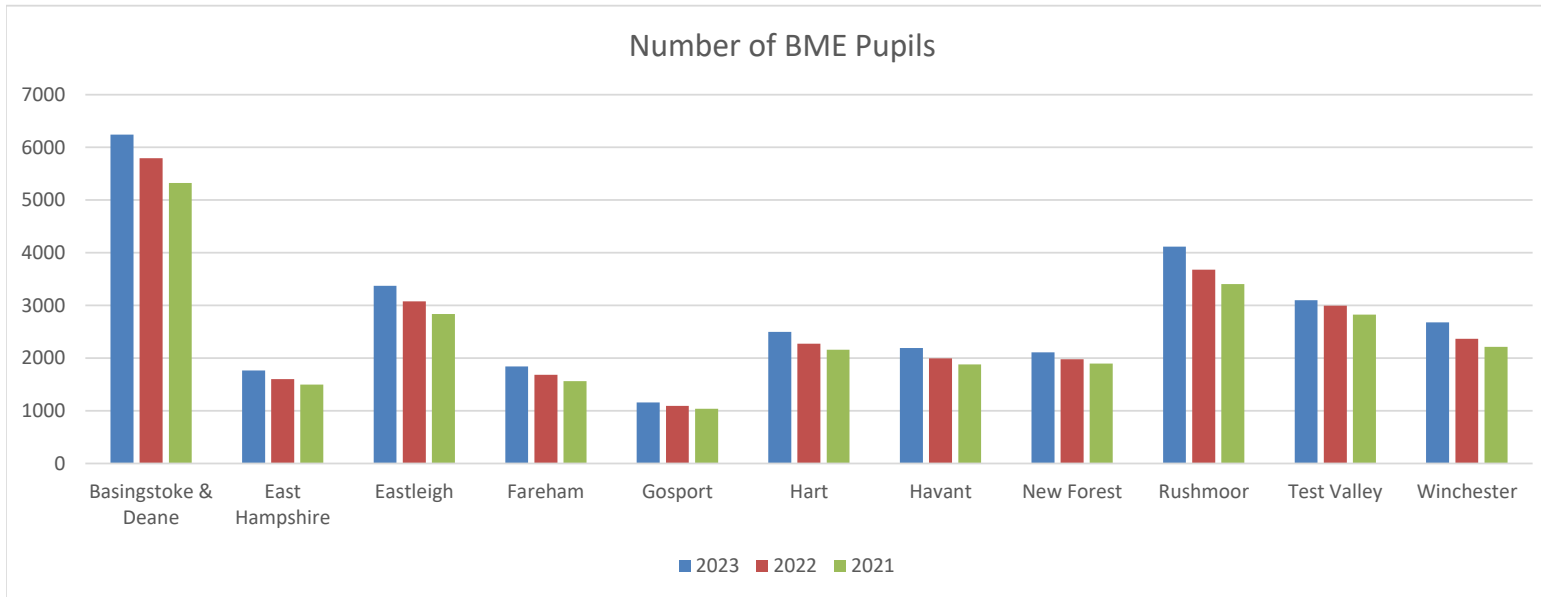

**EMTAS Referrals - Gosport and Hampshire Summary - Pupils for whom English is an Additional Language (EAL)  
Summary by Language and Academic Year**

EMTAS new referral data have been included to give an indication of languages spoken by those pupils who are most recently arrived. Whilst the numbers of referrals of children speaking each language have remained low In Gosport, we can see a gradual increase in the total of referrals since 2021. Many of the numbers for particular language groups are too small to be robust, but we can see a small increase in the number of Malayalam- and Sinhala-speaking children. The number of Ukrainian new arrivals has dropped slightly in the Gosport area but not in the county as a whole. (Note: The number of referrals for English-speaking children (see the Hampshire table below) includes children with access to another language in the home but who prefer to use English themselves.)

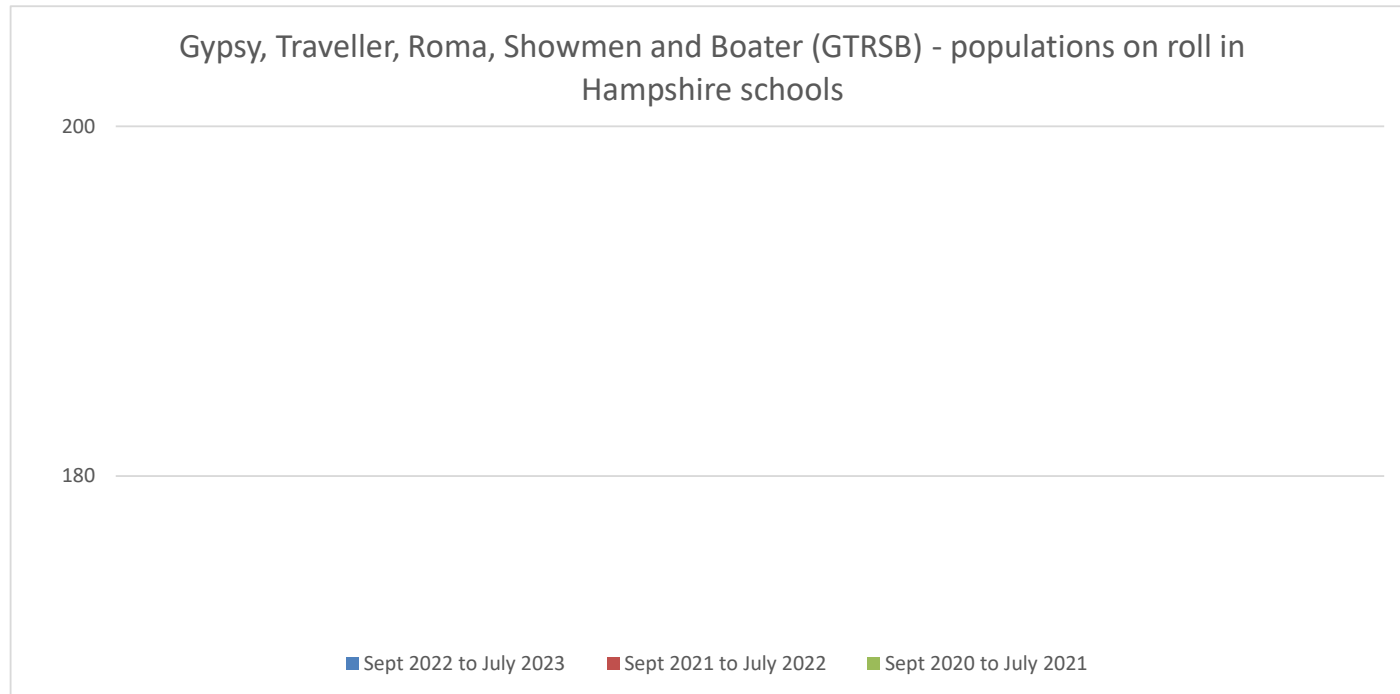
