EMTAS Summary Information

This data booklet shows the progress and attainment of children for whom English is an Additional Language (EAL) in Test Valley compared with non-EAL learners (EFL - 'English as a First Language') and with the Hampshire All and National cohorts.

According to the Spring 2024 School Census, 1678 (9.6%) of Hampshire's learners of EAL (English as an Additional Language) were in Test Valley schools. This is a higher number than in 2023 (1593), but in percentage terms the figure shows a drop (from 10.1% in 2023).

Within EMTAS, we recognise that different districts of Hampshire will have different needs according to their particular demographic.

All data that have been used are correct at the time of writing but may later be subject to minor changes as new data are published. Dates and sources are acknowledged. In some cases, numbers within the groups are very small. To maintain confidentiality, values of 5 or less represented as <6.

Note that where numbers are small although there may be an indication of a particular pattern, it is very difficult to draw any firm conclusions and the data should be used with caution.

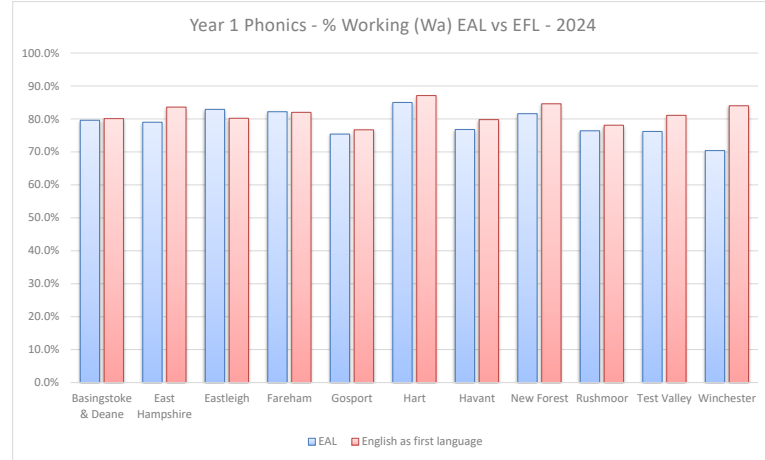

In Test Valley in 2024, KS2 outcomes for learners of EAL were above those of children with English as a first language. Outcomes for Test Valley were also above 'Hampshire all' for EAL, whereas outcomes for EFL were below the 'Hampshire all' figure. When compared with the national, EAL outcomes were higher.☐☐

Key Stage 2 Reading, Writing and Maths - Hampshire and National Outcomes - EAL/EFL/Unspecified Pupils - number and % achieving Expected Standard* Summary by Academic Year

Looking at the components separately, we see that outcomes at KS2 for learners of EAL were stronger in Maths than for EFL learners. In Maths, Test Valley's learners of EAL outperformed the national and 'Hampshire all' figures. In Reading EFL and EAL learners achieved the same result in Test Valley, but slightly below when compared to 'Hampshire all'. Test Valley's learners of EAL matched those in the national figures for Reading. In Writing, EAL learners outperformed EFL learners in Test Valley with a 9% difference. When compared to 'Hampshire all' EAL learners scored slightly higher than EFL learners. Test Valley's learners of EAL performed better than national figures.□

**Key Stage 4 - Test Valley, Hampshire and National Outcomes - EAL/EFL/Unspecified Pupils - % achieving Key Stage 4 benchmarks
Summary by Ethnicity and Academic Year**

Outcomes for Test Valley's learners of EAL at KS4 were better for the 'Progress 8' and 'Attainment 8' measures shown in comparison with the EFL cohort, but scored marginally less in 'Grade 9-4 English & Maths'. EAL learners outperformed in all 3 measures shown in 'Hampshire all' and national figures.

At 4%, authorised absence rates for academic year 2023-24 at Primary phase for Test Valley's learners of EAL placed the district joint 5th with Eastleigh and Fareham, were higher than rates for EFL learners in this district and higher than the 'Hampshire all' % for learners of EAL (3.9%) Unauthorised absence rates again placed Test Valley 5th, this time sharing that position with New Forest and Rushmoor. Test Valley's learners of EAL matched the 'Hampshire all' figure at 0.9%. Overall attendance was 95% for Test Valley, on a par with most of the other districts with only 2 higher at 96% (Rushmoor and Hart) and 1 lower at 94% (East Hants).

At secondary phase authorised absence rates for learners of EAL were 4.3% ranking Test Valley 4th). Test Valley's figure was lower than the EAL 'Hampshire all', 4.6%, and lower than the rate for EFL by district and for the county as a whole (5.6% and 6.4% respectively). In terms of unauthorised absence, Test Valley ranked 9th at 1.9%, above the EAL 'Hampshire all', 1.5% but below the figures for EFL by district and for the county as a whole. Overall attendance in Test Valley was 94%, above the EAL 'Hampshire all' (90.8%) but lower than all the other districts.
