



## Central & Eastern Berkshire Authorities – Joint Minerals & Waste Plan

### Focussed Regulation 18 Consultation: Sand & Gravel Provision and Operator Performance

The Central and Eastern Berkshire Authorities (Bracknell Forest Council, Reading Borough Council, The Royal Borough of Windsor & Maidenhead and Wokingham Borough Council) are working in partnership to produce a Joint Minerals and Waste Plan which will guide minerals and waste decision making in the Plan area up until 2036.

To-date several information gathering public consultations have been undertaken to inform the Plan, which together have informed part of this focussed Regulation 18 consultation. This consultation exercise focuses on 'Areas of Search' approach for minerals, two newly proposed sites and a policy on Operator Past Performance.

We would like to hear from you in respect of your views on the 'soundness' of the 'Areas of Search' approach, the newly proposed sites as well as the new Policy.
