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We support this policy in general however points a and b of this policy have been worded incorrectly.

The Regulation 19 policy states:

- “a. Apply the sequential test, exception test, where required, and sequential approach within the development site directing the most vulnerable development to the areas at lowest risk from flooding;
- b. Not result in an increased flood risk elsewhere and, where possible, reduce flood risk overall;”

We required the following wording:

“a) Apply the sequential test, exception test and sequential approach within the development site directing the most vulnerable development to the areas at lowest risk from flooding

b) Not result in an increased flood risk elsewhere and seek to reduce flood risk overall;”

Point a will need amending or clarified in the supporting text as the sequential test is required for all development in Flood Zones 2 and 3 unless it is minor development in accordance with paragraph 164 and footnote 50.

Point b is weaker in the Regulation 19 version of this policy by including the words ‘where possible’ when seeking to reduce flood risk overall. This is not in accordance with the Planning Practice Guidance which does not use the wording ‘where possible’

In addition to this in the supporting text you need to refer to the flood risk tables 1-3 in the Planning Practice Guidance and this sets out which kind of development is acceptable or not in each Flood Zone.

In the flood risk policy DM10 or in the restoration policy DM8 there should be wording included to say that flood risk will not be increased elsewhere in the restoration phases of the minerals quarrying.

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Paragraph 5.104 - This paragraph says:

“Landfill and hazardous waste facilities will not be permitted in Flood Risk Zones 3a and 3b”

Please be aware that in the Planning Practice Guidance it says that Landfill and sites used for waste management facilities for hazardous waste are More Vulnerable and that should not be permitted in Flood Zone 3b but can be located in Flood Zone 3a following the application of the sequential test and exception test. Please also be aware that there are other development types that should not be permitted in Flood Zones 3a and 3b. This paragraph also refers to pollution prevention which should be covered in a separate paragraph to one about flood risk.

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### Environmental Permit

Either the SFRA or the main Minerals & Waste Plan document should include an informative about sites which are adjacent to, or include, a main river needing an environmental permit. Currently environmental permits are only mentioned in the glossary of the Plan.
